An EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION degree provides students an understanding of developmentally appropriate practices and anti-bias approaches to teaching, preparing students for careers in educational settings such as infant/toddler caregivers, preschool teachers; family home childcare providers; master teachers, site supervisors, program directors, child life specialists, and social service workers. Curriculum focuses on theory and practice of early childhood care and education for children from birth to age eight for occupational preparation. The course of study will include the basic principles of educational and developmental psychology; the art of observing, teaching and guiding young children; planning and administration of developmentally appropriate inclusive educational

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

- \Rightarrow Visit the CAREER CENTER to learn about opportunities in the field and help determining if it is a good fit for your preferred values, strengths, skills, and interests. CSS 2nd floor.
- ⇒ Attend annual TRANSFER FAIR and TRANSFER CENTER WORKSHOPS to determine which university is the best fit for you as well as application requirements and transfer process.
- ⇒ JOB SHADOW and NETWORK WITH PROFESSIONALS in positions you wish to obtain.
- \Rightarrow Participate in campus clubs to gain **TEAMWORK** and **LEADERSHIP** skills.
- \Rightarrow Learn AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE and other foreign languages.
- ⇒ Gain experience by **VOLUNTEERING** or getting a **SUMMER JOB** at a camp, daycare centers, or tutoring center.
- \Rightarrow Obtain CPR and FIRST AID CERTIFICATIONS.
- ⇒ Join PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS such as the National Association for the Education of Young Children or the National Council on Family Relations to network and maintain current knowledge of opportunities in the field.

WHAT SKILLS DO I NEED?

- \Rightarrow Self-reflection monitoring/Assessing performance of yourself, other individuals, or organizations to make improvements or take corrective action.
- \Rightarrow Service Orientation actively looking for ways to help people.
- \Rightarrow Social Perceptiveness being aware of others' reactions and understanding why they react as they do.
- \Rightarrow Active Listening giving full attention to what other people are saying, taking time to understand the points being made, asking questions as appropriate, and not interrupting at inappropriate times.
- \Rightarrow **Coordination** adjusting actions in relation to others' actions.

PREFERRED WORK STYLES INCLUDE:

- \Rightarrow Self Control maintain composure, keeping emotions in check, controlling anger, and avoiding aggressive behavior, even in very difficult situations.
- \Rightarrow **Concern for Others** being sensitive to others' needs and feelings and being understanding and helpful on the job.
- \Rightarrow Integrity being honest and ethical.
- \Rightarrow Stress Tolerance accepting criticism and dealing calmly and effectively with high stress situations.
- \Rightarrow **Cooperation** being pleasant with others on the job and displaying a good-natured, cooperative attitude.
