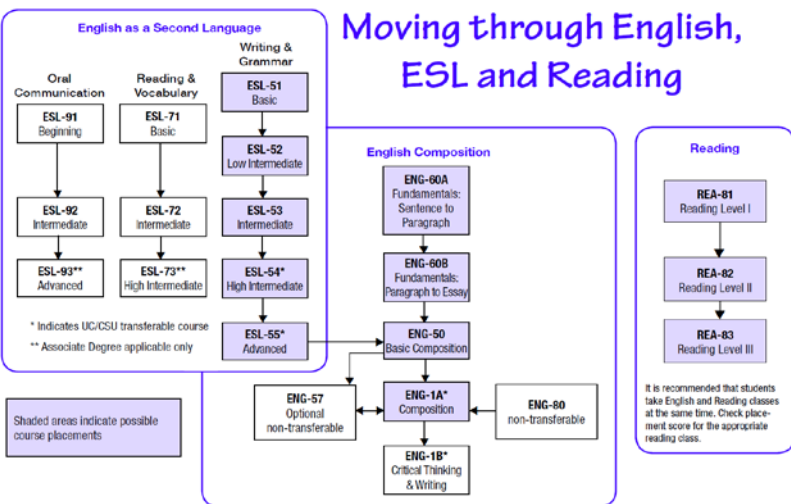

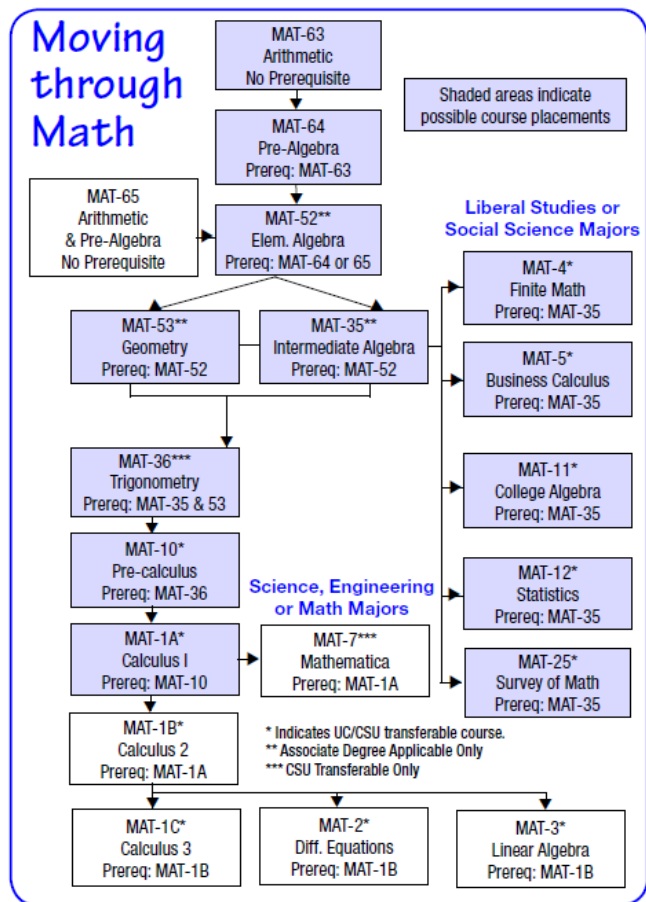

Excluding GEG & GEG lab and PHY-10/PHY-11; for science courses offered in Area 5A and 5B; students will be enrolled in the lecture and lab section with the same section number. Courses cannot be double-counted to satisfy more than one area. The only exception to this is several courses in Area 6 which can also be counted towards Area 3B. Courses that may be applied to one of two different areas are listed only in one area, with the second option listed in parentheses. Course offered in special cohorts are not listed here. Please consult the Schedule of Classes for courses offered in CAP, Honors, Puente, STEM Scholars, or T3P. CSU ONLY: Although not part of the GE requirement for transfer, 6 semester units of US History, Constitution and Government is a CSU graduation requirement that students may complete at Norco College prior to transfer. HIS-6 or 6H or 7 or 7H and POL-1 or 1H satisfy this requirement. Courses subject to cancellation

Final Examination Schedule

- Failure to report for scheduled final examinations may result in a failing grade for the course. In case of illness or other emergency, the student must report to the instructor's office or department prior to the beginning of the examination.
- Final examinations for evening (4:30PM and later) and Saturday and Sunday classes will be held at the time and place of the regular class meeting on the following dates:

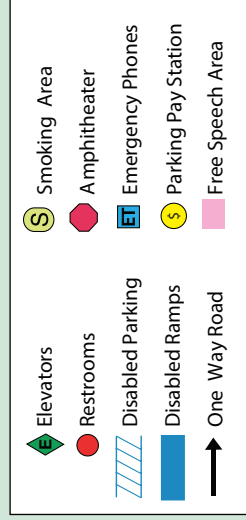
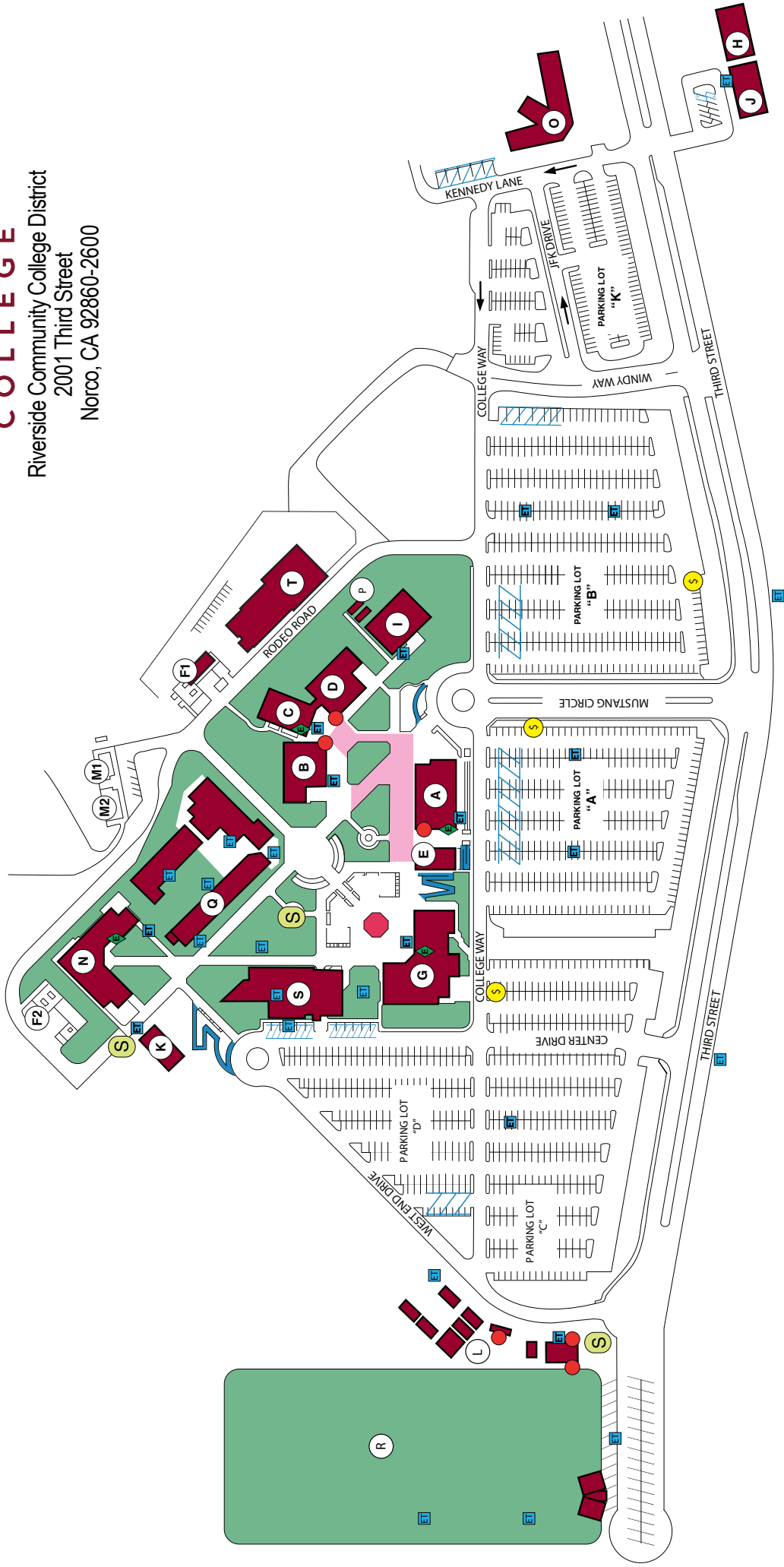
For classes not on the grid or conflicts that cannot be resolved, instructors will consult the department chair and the Norco College Dean of Instruction for resolutions.
