 - a. Overview

 - a. Standard I (Dr. Aycock)

- Standard I is about the institutional mission, academic quality and institutional effectiveness, and integrity.
- Mission: We need to see where we are now, why we are revising it and where we are going to be.
- Focus on processes such strategic plan or the gap analysis
- Have examples of data and decision making
- CTE has data that can be utilized
- b. Standard II (Dr. Lee)
 - Student learning programs and support services
 - · Look for the action verbs and adjectives: identify the subject of the standards
 - Are we offering educational programs and are they appropriate. They need to be mission driven.
 - Demonstrating that you have a cycle, you are doing it and sticking to it
 - Assessing learning outcomes: Curriculum committee demonstrate to achieve these outcomes.
 - Program evaluation can be used as well.
- c. Standard III (Dr. Lee)
 - Resource allocation model
 - EMP's to discipline goals
- d. Standard IV (Dr. Lee)
 - Leadership and governance
 - Think about what you do in a multi-college district:
 - Function maps (they are very detailed).
 - Details on centralized services

 - a. What it is, how it works
 - b. The template
 - Provided a template to accreditation committee members to utilize when submitting information
 - This document will be the worksheet for everyone
 - The template has to be submitted for review as soon as possible to identify any gaps.

 - What are the checkable things you need to look at
 - Something that is hard copy needs to be scanned
 - Gather all the evidence and see what it tells you
 - Evidence collected from prior years is located in the website to use as an example to gather current evidence.

 - Quality focus essay, more information to come as draft develops
 - Take an ownership approach
