Congratulations Graduates!

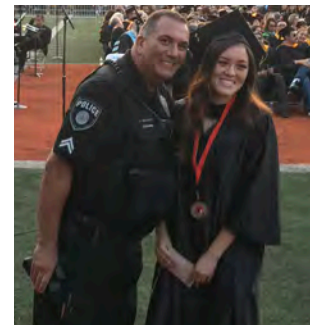

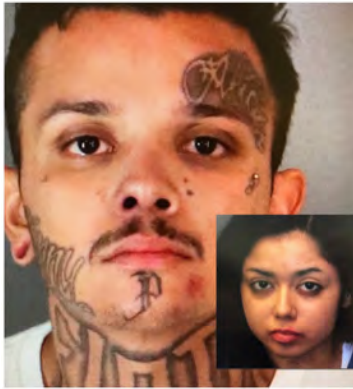
Coordinator Dassow was awarded his 10 year pin. We want to thank these individuals for their years of hard work and dedication to Riverside Community College District!
