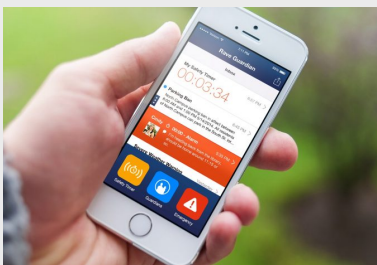
Jessica Diaz has recently received a promotion from Community Service Aide to Administrative Assistant. Jessica has been with our department for 6 years and we are happy to see her grow.

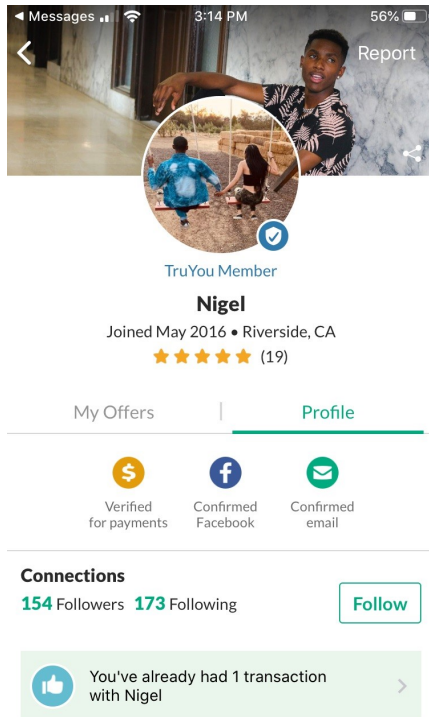

Cop Corner



On December 10, 2019, at 9:40 pm, Officer Kleveno was dispatched to a report of a robbery in lot B. Upon arrival, Kleveno contacted the reporting party and asked her to describe the events that took place. She informed the Officer that she came to RCC to purchase an iPhone from a seller listed on Offerup, from whom she had previously purchased a PS4. When she met the seller, who was listed as "Josh" on the account, he handed her son the iPhone for inspection. As her son inspected the phone, she pulled out the agreed upon

\$260.00 for payment. She gave "Josh" the money and he began to count it from inside his vehicle. When he finished counting he quickly snatched the iPhone out of the son's hand and drove off, with screeching tires, with the money and item. Officer Kleveno conducted a thorough investigation of the crime and received a search warrant for the Offerup account used by the perpetrator. "Josh" had already changed his account name to "Nigel" however the Officer had found his true identity to be Michael Alderson Jr (not a current enrolled student). After receiving another warrant for the believed residence of the suspect, Michael Alderson Jr. was placed under arrest. Kleveno spoke to the suspects roommate who disclosed that several of his belongings had recently gone missing including a PS4 back in October. After further investigation, Kleveno found proof that the victim had purchased that PS4 from Alderson Jr. in October.
