- Keep at least 6 feet away from others.

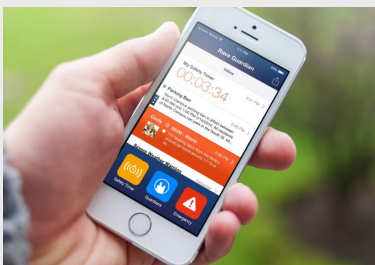

- If you allow RAVEGuardian, you can receive important notifications based on your location



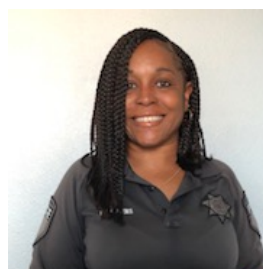
9th Annual Chief's Breakfast

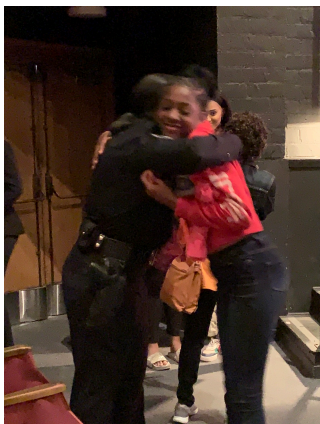
