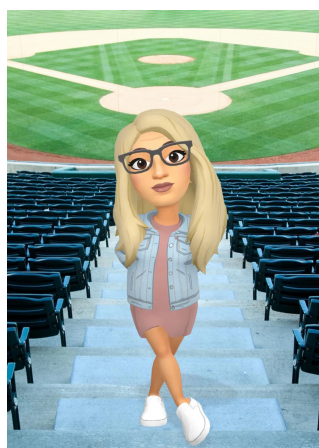

GENERAL DUAL ENROLLMENT

These online classes are offered to ALL dual students no matter your high school location

ADJ 9- 32042, Law American Society
Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

A general survey of practical law intended as an introduction to the American legal system and to acquaint the student with elements of the law that affect everyday legal relationships: criminal and juvenile justice, consumer law, family law, housing law, and individual rights and liberties. Emphasis is placed on the philosophical and political foundations of law and on civil law. Recommended for prelaw students and for others interested in the practical application of the law. UC/CSU transferable.

ART 6- 32106, Art Appreciation
Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An introductory course for the non-art major. The creative process and the diversity of style, technique and media, evident in various art forms throughout history and culture. (Same as AHS-6).

UC/CSU transferable.. 3 units

BIO 10-33103, Life Science Principles
Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

For non-life science majors. An introduction to the principles of life sciences through the study of basic biological concepts of living organisms involving structure, behavior, evolutionary relationships and the social and environmental implications of life science. UC/CSU transferable . 3 units

EAR 42-32317, Child Family and Community
Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An examination of the developing child in a societal context which focuses on the interrelationships of family, school, and community and emphasizes historical and socio-cultural factors. The processes of socialization and identity development will be highlighted. CSU transferable. 3 units

ENG 1A, English Composition
33149 OR 33150
Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

Emphasizes skills in critical reading, and writing, including research. Integrated reading and writing assignments respond to various rhetorical situations. Students will produce a minimum of 7500 words of assessed writing. Classroom instruction integrates writing lab activities

UC/CSU transferable. 4 units

GUI 47- 32553, Career Explore/ Life Planning
Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

In depth career and life planning: Topics include extensive exploration of one's values, interests and abilities; life problem-solving and self-management skills; adult development theory and the changes that occur over the life span; self assessment including identifying one's skills and matching personality with work. An intensive career investigation; decision making, goal setting and job search strategies, as well as resume writing and interviewing skills will also be addressed. This course is designed to assist those students considering the transition of a career change or undecided about the selection of a college major. UC/CSU Transferable. 3 units

MUS 19- 33154, Music Appreciation
Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

A broad survey of music in the Western world, including terminology for describing musical elements, forms, and styles. Organized to acquaint students with the roles of music and musicians in society and with representative musical selections through listening.

UC/CSU Transferable, 3 units

ART-22-32092, Basic Design

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An introduction to the fundamentals of two-dimensional design. The organization of visual elements according to the principles of design. Emphasis placed on visual perception, theory, dexterity, problem solving, analysis, application, skill, and presentation. 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

GUI-47-32548, Career Exploration and Life Planning

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

In depth career and life planning: Topics include extensive exploration of one's values, interests and abilities; life problem-solving and self-management skills; adult development theory and the changes that occur over the life span; self-assessment including identifying one's skills and matching personality with work. An intensive career investigation: decision making, goal setting and job search strategies, as well as resume writing and interviewing skills will also be addressed. POL-1-32856, American Politics

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An introduction to the principles, structures, processes, and culture that inform American politics. Specific focus is placed on the development of the Constitution, the government it engenders, the development of the American polity, the formation of policy, and the connections between the national government and California's government. 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

CENTENNIAL

ADJ-1-32027, Introduction to the Administration of Justice

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

The history and philosophy of administration of justice in America; recapitulation of the system; identifying the various subsystems, role expectations, and their interrelationships; theories of crime, punishment, and rehabilitation; ethics, education, and training for professionalism in the system. 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

ADJ-19-33094, Introduction to Policing

Online. Start/End Dates: 4/15/2024-6/7/2024

The history and development of American policing structures, including an overview of the different eras of policing and its evolution. An examination of community expectations of law enforcement and law enforcement professional expectations. An introduction to chain of command and the structure of police agencies, including recruitment and hiring practices. An analysis of the culture and training within law enforcement agencies, including a factual and research-based analysis of use of force issues. Discussion of successes and challenges within modern policing, including controversial topics within policing. Discussion of community oriented policing strategies, crime analysis, and future needs and evolutions of policing. 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

AHS-6-32048, Art Appreciation

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An introductory course for the non-art major. The creative process and the diversity of style, technique and media, evident in various art forms throughout history and culture. 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

EAR-20-32305, Child Growth and Development

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

This introductory course examines the major physical, psychosocial, and cognitive/language developmental milestones for children, both typical and atypical, from conception through adolescence. Emphasis on interactions between maturational processes and environmental factors. While studying developmental theory and investigative research methodologies, students will observe children, evaluate individual differences and analyze characteristics of development at various stages. Outside observations required. 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

EAR-42-32316, Child, Family, and Community

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An examination of the developing child in a societal context which focuses on the interrelationships of family, school, and community and emphasizes historical and socio-cultural factors. The processes of socialization and identity development will be highlighted. 3 Units, CSU Transferable

RLE- 80-32913, Real Estate Principles

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

The real estate principles course covers basic laws and principles of California real estate; fundamentals, terminology, concepts, current practices and current market trends in real estate. Assists those preparing for the real estate sales person and broker license examination. 3 Units, CSU Transferable

ERHS B101 (Hybrid), Th, 7:30-9:20 AM, Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An introductory course for the non-art major. The creative process and the diversity of style, technique and media, evident in various art forms throughout history and culture. UC/CSU transferable 3 units

BIO 18 - 32120, Human Genetics

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

A general education course for non-biology majors and allied health students who are interested in the underlying mechanisms of human heredity. Emphasis will be given to the role of genetics and environment on cells, individuals, family and human populations. Discussion on human genetic disorders and the social implications of modern human genetics will be included. UC/CSU transferable 3 units

BIO 45- 32127, Survey of Human Anatomy and Physiology

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An introductory and survey course of structural and functional aspects of the human body. Emphasis is placed on cell organization, human tissues, and discussion of each of the human systems. UC/CSU transferable 3 units

COM 1- 32236, Public Speaking

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

An introductory and survey course of structural and functional aspects of the human body. Emphasis is placed on cell organization, human tissues, and discussion of each of the human systems. UC/CSU transferable 3 units

ENG 1B (33179), Critical Thinking and Writing

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

Students will critically read diverse literary texts in order to compose inquiry-driven writing. Students will write a minimum of 7500 words of assessed writing. Classroom instruction integrates writing lab activities. Students may not receive credit for both ENG-1B and IBH. 72 hours lecture and 18 hours laboratory. UC/CSU transferable 4 units

ENP 50- 32480, Intro to Entrepreneurship

Online. Start/End Dates: 2/12/2024-6/7/2024

Designed for those interested in starting their own business, either as their primary income or extra income, including individual contributor businesses such as freelancers, contractors, consultants, and others in the gig economy. The curriculum is centered on three key aspects of entrepreneurship: 1) the individual, their traits, skills, and attributes that make entrepreneurs successful, 2) the business ideas, how to generate them, where to look for them, how to expand them, and 3) how to ensure they are valid business ideas with potential to meet profit goals. These elements, developed in the course, will assist any current or potential entrepreneur develop and grow a business now or in the future. CSU transferable 3 units

A comprehensive study of measures of central tendency and variation, correlation and linear regression, probability, the normal distribution, the t-distribution, the chisquare distribution, estimation, testing of hypotheses, analysis of variance, and the application of statistical software to data, including the interpretation of the relevance of the statistical findings. Applications using data from business, education, health science, life science, psychology, and the social sciences will be included. UC/CSU transferable. 4 units

Prerequisite: MAT-1A

1. Who can participate?

All students starting freshman year through 12th grade at any of the following High Schools:

-All CNUUSD High Schools, Jurupa Valley High School, CAVA, IQLA, and La Sierra High School

2. How do I apply?

Complete the Norco College admissions application through cccapply.org using your personal email address. **(Do not use your CNUUSD email)** Students must create an account and apply online for the upcoming term. After submitting the application, students must wait 1-2 business days to receive the "Welcome to Norco College" email.

3. How to Access MyPortal?

Wait 1-2 business days to receive your "Welcome to Norco College" email sent from admissions@norcocollege.edu (search through all folders, including junk/spam)

Follow steps on Welcome email to login with temporary password.

*Activate your RCCD student email account right away through MyPortal using your RCCD student email and password.

4. How to reset MyPortal Password?
