## INSTITUTION-SET STANDARDS 2018 ACCJC ANNUAL REPORT NORCO COLLEGE

Institution-Set Standards (ISS) are the lowest outcome levels which are acceptable to an institution. ISS are not goals to which the college aspires. Rather, they are the level that marks when the institution is moving into a "danger zone" for a specific outcome area. The methodology involved in setting the ISS is by calculating the value of one-half a standard deviation below a 5-year mean. When values fall below the ISS for at least 2 years, a procedural response which addresses what will be done to raise outcomes in the area has been created by the Norco Academic Senate and approved by the Institutional Strategic Planning Council. 1. Successful student course completion rate for the fall 2017 semester: 70.7

Outcome ISS 70.7% 70.0%

<u>Definition</u>: The percentage of student enrollments that receive a "C" or better or a "P" (Pass/No Pass).

<u>Methodology</u>: Determined the average success rate over the past 5 years and identified the percent that was 0.5 standard deviations below that mean.

2. Number of degrees awarded in the 2016-2017 academic year:

<u>Definition</u>: The number of students who receive one or more degrees between the period of July 1 and June 30 of the academic year as indicated in MIS data files.

<u>Methodology</u>: Identified 4 successive years of unduplicated students receiving degree(s), calculated the mean and identified the number that was 0.5 standard deviations below that mean.

3. Number of certificates awarded in the 2016-2017 academic year:

<u>Definition</u>: The number of students who receive one or more certificates (State Chancellor's Office approved) between the period of July 1 and June 30 of the academic year as indicated in MIS data files.

<u>Methodology</u>: Identified 5 successive years of unduplicated students receiving degree(s), calculated the mean and identified the number that was 0.5 standard deviations below that mean.

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4. Number of students who transferred to 4-year colleges/universities in 2016-2017:

Outcome	ISS

<u>Definition</u>: The institution standard is the number of Norco College students who were enrolled in the previous academic year and then transfer to a 4-yr institution between the period of June 1 and May 31 of the next academic year.

<u>Methodology</u>: Identified 5 successive years of transfer students at Norco College (defined as completing at least 12 units in RCCD and the majority of completed units at Norco College), calculated the mean and identified the value 0.5 standard deviations below that mean.

5. 2015-2016 job placement rates for students completing certificate programs and CTE (career-technical education) degrees:

<u>Definition</u>: Percentage of graduates with certificates and or degrees in CTE areas that were employed any quarter during the year after graduating.

<u>Methodology</u>: Identified 4 years of job placement rates for graduates and identified the value 0.5 standard deviations below the weighted mean for each career area.
