## **PUENTE**

#### 2019 - 2020 PUENTE Interest Form

The PUENTE Community College Program is an academic, counseling, and mentoring program of support for students to build the skills necessary for success in both academic and career goals while in community college. Students enrolled in the PUENTE program work closely with their Counselor, English Instructor, and Mentor to prepare for transfer to four-year colleges and universities, with the ultimate goal that Puentistas return to their community as leaders and mentors.

When students are in the Puente Program, they are committing to the active participation in the yearlong learning community where the 30-student cohort will take English and Guidance classes together over one academic year. Learning communities offer a supportive environment where students feel involved, motivated, and encouraged to build transfer-ready academic strategies and skills.

The PUENTE counseling component provides academic, personal, and career advising to prepare students to transfer to a four-year college or university. The PUENTE counselor teaches transfer-credit Guidance courses in Fall (GUD 48) and Spring semester (GUD 47), touching on subject matters such a personal development, relevant college and career success skills, information, and resources to assist each student in examining, planning, and setting her/his personal, academic, and career goals.



PUENTE's English component includes a developmental writing course in the first semester (English 50) followed by a college transfer-level English composition course (English 1A). The writing classroom environment in the Puente Program allows students to develop their writer's voice with confidence while working with rigorous academic texts.

PUENTE mentoring component offers students the opportunity to be paired with local professionals who graciously volunteer their time for one-on-one mentoring sharing their stories of their academic and career paths and what they learned about being a successful professional. Our community mentors support their students' college going aspirations; they help guide and motivate their mentee's to build the social and cultural capital they will need for their future



STEM professionals include engineers, electricians, architects and game developers. The School of STEM includes two distinct programs designed for students pursuing degrees in the fields of

Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The first program, STEM Pathways at Norco College, includes two distinct programs designed for students pursuing degrees in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The first program, Engineering Pathways, provides opportunities for students seeking transfer to 4-year universities in Civil, Mechanical, Electric, Computer and other diverse fields of engineering. The Engineering Pathways program provides students with direct assistance, educational planning and academic coaching from entrance to transfer. The program also provides internship and research opportunities for students. The second program, STEM Scholars, is a program that provides assistance to students pursuing the physical, life, and natural sciences, computer science and mathematics degrees. STEM scholars receive career and

academic counseling, mentoring and assistance with the transfer process.







## Veterans Resource Center

Norco College welcomes all veterans, active duty military members, and VA dependants with varying educational goals to begin or continue their education. Whether you are refining your skills, seeking to transfer, planning to earn an Associate Degree, or completing an Occupational Certificate, we will do our best to assist you as you embark on an exciting educational journey at our institution.

Active duty service members and reservists are granted priority registration. Veterans are also eligible for priority registration for a period of four years when used within fifteen years after discharge from active duty. This allows those who qualify to be among the first student allowed to register for classes. Please bring your DD214 (Discharge Documents) or other qualifying paperwork to our office in order to determine your eligibility and get started.

If you are called to active duty after enrolling in classes at Norco College, you will be allowed to drop your course(s), receive MW (Military Withdrawal) status on your transcript. The notation of MW is not counted in calculating your overall grade point average(GPA).

Norco College fully adheres to the Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act of 2014 and California Assembly Bill 13.
