With EduNav, you plan and register for all your courses in a guided, intuitive system personalized to your needs and preferences. You can quickly:


- Visualize your pathway to graduation, term by term - and understand how any changes to your plan affect your completion timeline

HELPING STUDENTS WITH QUESTIONS ABOUT THEIR ENGLISH AND MATH PLACEMENT (AB705)

HOW STUDENTS ARE PLACED IN ENGLISH AND MATH (WHAT TSUM SCORE) AT NORCO COLLEGE:

NEWLY APPLIED COLLEGE STUDENTS:

- A student who is a current senior in a U.S. high school or graduated within the past 10 years –
 - Answers questions on the CCC Apply admissions application – Placement is generated 1-2 days after completion of the application
- A student who graduated from a U.S. high school more than 10 years ago, or from a non-U.S. high school, or did not receive a U.S. high school diploma –
 - Will receive a placement survey by email (Google Doc) – Placement is generated 1-2 days after receipt of the placement survey

CURRENT STUDENTS:

- May login to WEBADVISOR, and select “Placement Test Survey” (found under Academic Planning section of student menu) – Placement is generated 1-2 days after completion of survey

TRANSFERRING IN STUDENTS:

- Asked to submit transcripts from outside institutions. Rules as described under item #1 apply if the student has no prior English and/or math course instruction. Otherwise, a prerequisite validation and/or matriculation may be determined useful to submit by a counselor.

DUAL & CONCURRENT ENROLLED students:

- Student should be referred to the Assessment Center for assistance – Staff in these programs can also be of assistance

EVALUATIONS UPDATE- AMERICAN INSTITUTIONS

- If a student has requested an official, comprehensive evaluation of his/her official transcript from an accredited school. Not recommended for transcripts from CCC's, CSU's and UC's.
- **NOTE:** An evaluation request should never be requested for a program of study or degree code that is not found in the Norco College catalog
 - Example, Norco does not offer Nursing, therefore the evaluation request cannot be in relation to the Nursing Program at RCC. Instead, select a program of study that is relatable.



Example: UCLA Transfer

If a student has a score of 3 on AP exam it will show on Colleague as equivalent to PSY 1– HOWEVER, if PSY is their major they would not get credit for PSY 1 and would be seen as missing major prep. A score of 4-5 is needed.

Things to consider- For transfer via an ADT- if we give credit for PSY 1 it will be used for PSY 1 in the ADT.

When student completes a higher-level course with a “C” or better and the Dean of Admissions & Records approves the granting of credit, student will be given credit (not a grade) for a lower-level course.

Maximum credit is one class per term. Students must complete the criteria listed below to be eligible for credit-by-examination. Students must be enrolled in a Norco College course. Students must fill out a new request for each additional course in the following terms. Students may receive credit-by-examination in one course for each term in a total unit amount not to exceed 15 units. Students who are transferring to a 4-year institution are encouraged to consult with a counselor prior to applying for credit-by-examination. Students may not receive credit for levels 3N, 8, 11 or 12 through the Credit-by-Examination process.

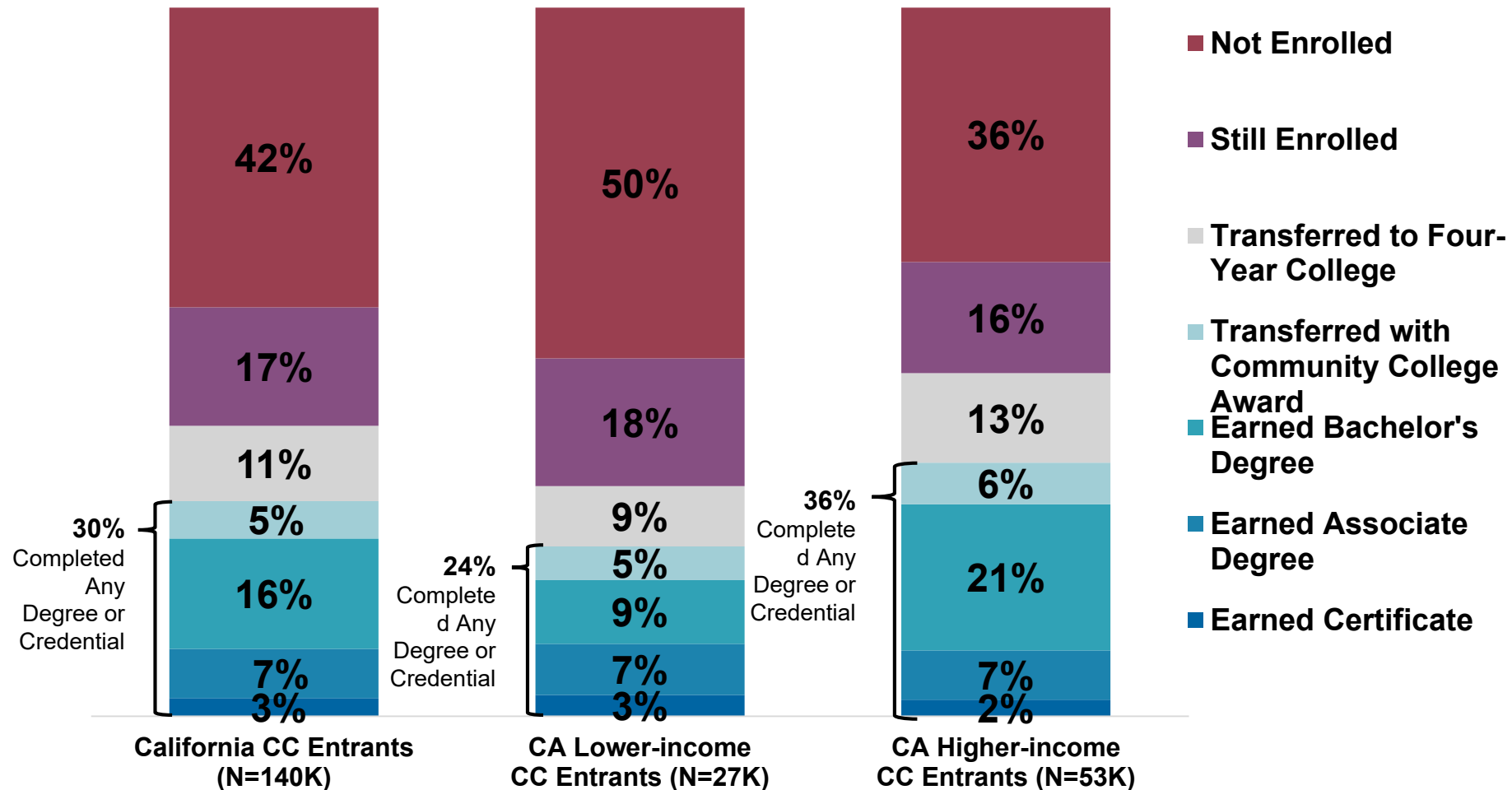

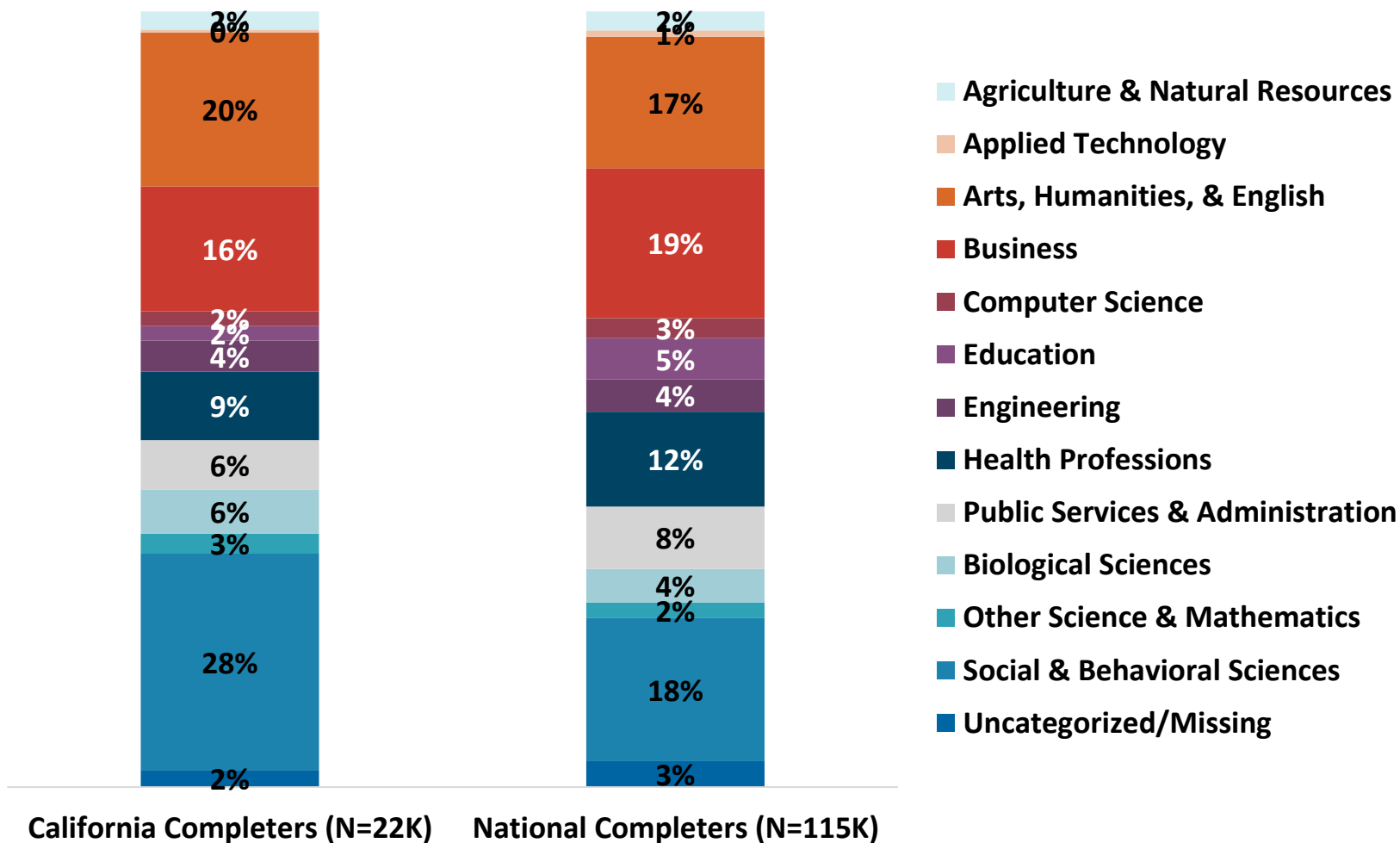

California: Highest Outcomes in Six Years by Income Among FTEIC Degree-Seeking Community College Students (Excluding Dual Enrollment Students)

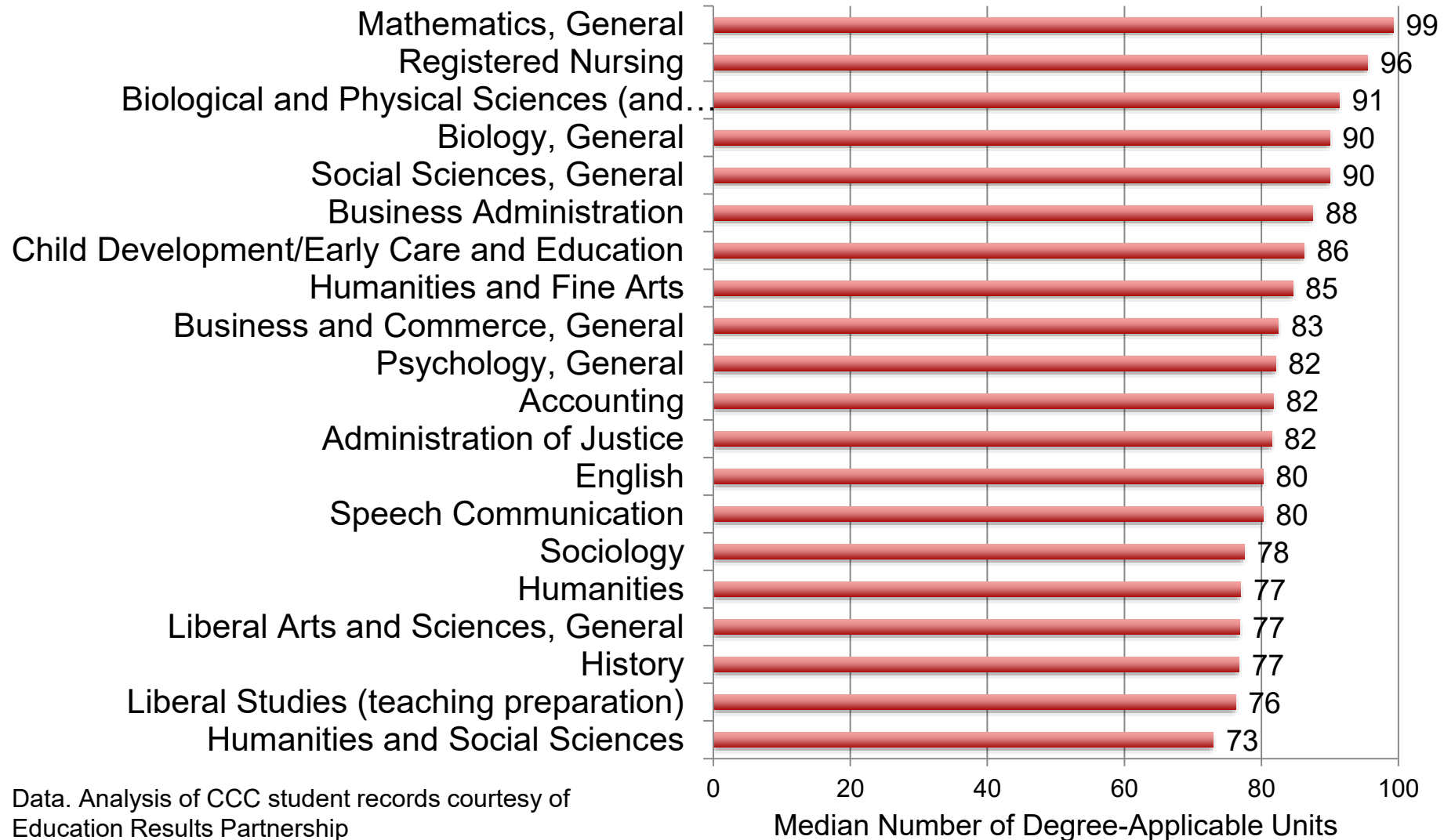

Bachelor's Degree Completer Program Areas Among Community College Entrants (Fall 2010 FTEIC Cohort)

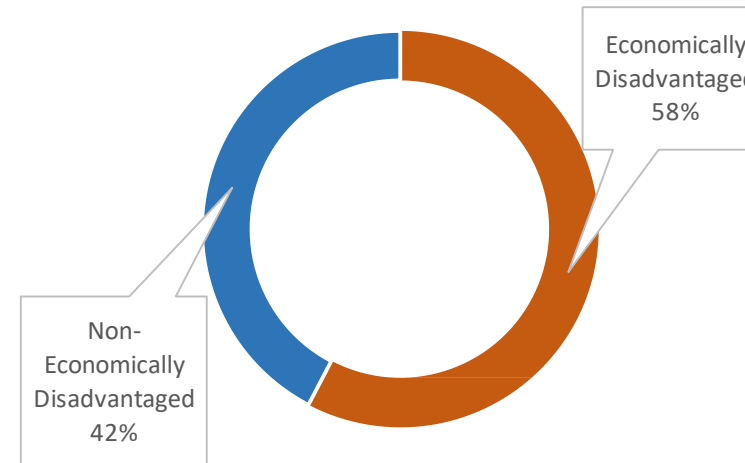


Median credits earned by associate degree completers 20 CCC programs with the most completers in 2015-16

- Many students (20-40%) who apply don't show up on day 1
- Over 40% of first-time students are gone from higher ed by year 2
- Too many students meander, earning credits that don't apply to a degree
- Most students transfer without earning cc credential; many who transfer can't apply credits toward major
- Certificate, AA and BA completion rates well below national average; achievement gaps by race, income and age are stark
- Nearly 20% still enrolled with no credential after 6 years
- Few non-credit students advance to credit programs
