Today: Serving over 14,000 students enrolled with over 300 employees







Cal Poly Example: 2 years with Norco College living at home. 2 years with Cal Poly living in apartment. Cost savings = \$36,200


UCLA Example: 2 years with Norco College living at home. 2 years with UCLA living in apartment. Cost savings = \$51,600
