

## Student Services Outcomes 2022

### Student Life

#### PLO

- 1) Students who interact with Student Life programs will gain self-awareness, self-confidence, and self-understanding in a structured environment.

#### Health Services SAO/SLOs

- 1) Students will be able to correctly identify at least 2 ways stress affects student success after attending one presentation.
- 2) Students will utilize physical and mental healthcare management tools and services on campus.
- 3) Students who engage in mental health services will be able to better manage their mental health.

#### Student Life SAO/SLOs

- 1) Students who engage in student life activities will be able to identify at least two leadership styles with which they identify.
- 2) Students who participate in student government will be able to develop an organizational mission and vision statement.
- 3) Students who participate in student life activities will learn at least two new networking skills for their leadership growth.

#### Special Funded Programs

PLO: Students engaged in Special Funded Programs will be able to identify and mitigate challenges through various support services, activities, workshops, and counseling contacts.

#### EOPS/CARE/NextUp

1. **SLO: Students who participate in the EOPS/CARE/NextUp program will receive over and above services which will lead to the students' ability to exhibit the knowledge and skills to make progress towards their educational goals.**

Activities: Three-term contacts with an advisor and/or counselor; workshops; educational benefits; case management approach.

Measurement: Assess persistence, success, and GPA data

2. **SAO: Students who participate in EOPS/CARE/NextUp will complete a comprehensive Education Plan (SEP)**

Activities: 3-Required counseling appointments; staff follow-up with students to schedule appt.

Measurement: Completion of Comprehensive SEP; SARS records of student contacts.

#### CalWORKs

1. **SLO: CalWORKs students will develop a comprehensive Student Educational Plan (SEP) that reflects the requirements for at least one of the following academic goals: certificate, associate degrees, and/or transfer that leads to self-sufficiency.**

Activities: SARS records-Counseling appointments; Check-In mid-semester meetings with Ed Advisor

Measurement: SARS data for SEP records and Check-in records; persistence data via MIS.

2. **SAO-The CalWORKs program will increase program enrollment via recruitment efforts.**

Activities: Recruitment with county partners; job clubs; college Fin Aid records

Measurement: 10% increase; baseline 2022-28 students

### **Phoenix Scholars**

1. **SLO: Students who participate in the Phoenix Scholars program will receive over and above services which will lead to the students' ability to exhibit the knowledge and skills to make progress towards their educational goals.**

Activities: Six mandatory term contacts with staff and/or counselor; workshops; educational benefits; case management.

Measurement: Assess persistence, success, and GPA data

2. **SAO: Students who participate in Phoenix Scholars will complete a comprehensive Education Plan (SEP)**

Activities: Three mandatory contacts with the program counselor

Measurement: Comp SEP completion and on file

3. **SAO-The Phoenix Scholars program will increase program enrollment via recruitment efforts. (10% ea yr)**

Activities: Recruitment with county partners; job clubs; college Fin Aid records; housing programs

Measurement: 10% increase; baseline 2022-32 students

### **Unity Zone**

1. **SLO: Workshops facilitated by the Unity Zone will promote student awareness and increased personal development.**

Activities: Workshops throughout the term; guest speakers; community advocates

Measurement: Post Survey after each event

2. **SAO: The Unity Zone serving LGBTQIA+ and Undocumented students will provide supportive services both online and in-person which will result in an increased sense of belonging, greater self-awareness, and increased ability to access supportive services at Norco College.**

Activities: Track services obtained in person and online; types of services and student satisfaction with services received.

Measurement: Online/In-person service tracking; satisfaction of services offered in the Unity Zone.

## **DRC**

1. **SLO: DRC students will understand the connection between their approved services and their disability-related needs.**

Activities: Counseling appointments, workshops

Measurements: Completion of AAP (Academic Adjustment Plan)

2. **SAO: Enrolled DRC students will have at least one documented contact in order to meet Title 5 requirements.**

Activities: Meetings with program personnel and/or counselor

Measurements: SARS record of student contacts. Academic Adjustment Request Form submissions, SAM contact logs.
