Keynote- Optimizing the Student Experience Through an Equity- Based Guided Pathways Framework: New Directions and Getting the Work Done

Session 1 &2- Concurrent

Pillar 1 – Pathway Updates: In this session you will learn about how Norco College is helping to “Clarify the Path” for students. Historically, the connection between academics and careers has lived primarily in Career Technical Education programs and not in the Liberal Art Education programs that the vast majority of our students elect as their academic pathway. All academic pathways have a connection to careers and in order to “Clarify the Path” for students, we will need to clarify for ourselves what that connection is. Our Pathway Updates session will help to rectify that misunderstanding through research, data, and the utilization of our most valued resource, the people that work at Norco College.

Pillar 2 – Strategic Enrollment Management: Strategic Enrollment Management (SEM) is a holistic approach to aligning student enrollment goals with the college’s mission and institutional plans. This session will review the work of the Pathways and Enrollment Management workgroup’s work to date on creating a renewed structure for Enrollment Management at Norco College as we move from recruitment to a focus on the full student journey.

Pillar 3 – Student Engagement: In this session participants will learn about high impact practices and relevant research in student engagement and participate in activities to identify opportunities for increasing student engagement within their area/role at the institution.

Pillar 4 – Equitable Assessment: Pillar 4 focuses everyone at the institution on ensuring that students are learning. How can everyone, whether you teach in the classroom or not, ensure that ALL students are learning as a result of your efforts at Norco College? This session will provide some high-impact practices that can be employed in your work, and we will encourage you to think how you can assess your student impact.
