

California Community Colleges are now offering Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT's) to the CSU. These may include Associate in Arts (AA-T) or Associate in Science (AS-T) degrees. These degrees are designed to provide a clear pathway to a CSU major and baccalaureate degree. California Community College students who are awarded an AA-T or AS-T degree are guaranteed admission with junior standing somewhere in the CSU system and given priority admission consideration to their local CSU campus or to a program that is deemed similar to their community college major. This priority does not guarantee admission to specific majors or campuses. Students who have been awarded an AA-T or AS-T are able to complete their remaining requirements for the 120-unit baccalaureate degree within 60 semester or 90 quarter units. The Associate in Arts in Geography for Transfer Degree (ADT) is designed to prepare students to successfully transfer to CSU or UC Bachelor's Degree Geography programs with junior status. Using the fundamentals of the scientific method, critical thinking, research methods, spatial data analysis, and landscape interpretation, the Geography ADT will prepare students for study in a wide range of 4-year degrees in environmental and social science fields.

**Associate in Arts for Transfer Degree**

The Associate in Arts in Geography for Transfer degree will be awarded upon completion of 60 California State University (CSU) transferable units including the above major requirements and the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) requirements with a minimum grade point average of 2.0. All courses in the major must be completed with a grade of "C" (or "P") or better.
