Associate Degree for TransferSM

California Community Colleges are now offering Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT's) to the CSU. These may include Associate in Arts (AA-T) or Associate in Science (AS-T) degrees. These degrees are designed to provide a clear pathway to a CSU major and baccalaureate degree. California Community College students who are awarded an AA-T or AS-T degree are guaranteed admission with junior standing somewhere in the CSU system and given priority admission consideration to their local CSU campus or to a program that is deemed similar to their community college major. This priority does not guarantee admission to specific majors or campuses. Students who have been awarded an AA-T or AS-T are able to complete their remaining requirements for the 120-unit baccalaureate degree within 60 semester or 90 quarter units. LAW, PUBLIC POLICY, AND SOCIETY (Cal-GETC) NAA1008

This interdisciplinary degree is designed to facilitate the student's seamless transfer from Norco College to the California State University (CSU) System with an Associate in Arts in Law, Public Policy, and Society for Transfer degree. This interdisciplinary degree highlights coursework that is appropriate for a student considering law school as it emphasizes the development of logical, analytical and communication skills, introduces students to the legal field, and provides preparation of further study in a variety of majors such as Philosophy, Economics, Political Science, Communication Studies, History, or Social and Behavioral Sciences. Students who opt to pursue this course of study are encouraged to engage in further exploration of one or more specific majors as they select electives for degree completion.
