A **SOCIOLOGY** degree teaches students about the development, nature, and transformation of societal organization. Core courses include the examination of historical and contemporary theory and research as the basis from which to gain an in-depth awareness and understanding of the world in which we live. Emphasis is placed on how social structure creates inequality based on group membership such as ethnicity, class and gender. Social forces such as social conflict, collective behavior, social movements, and organizational and institutional influences are explored.

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

- ⇒ Visit the **CAREER CENTER** to learn about opportunities in the field and help determining if it is a good fit for your preferred values, strengths, skills, and interests. CSS 2nd floor.
- ⇒ Attend annual **TRANSFER FAIR** and **TRANSFER CENTER WORKSHOPS** to determine which university is the best fit for you as well as application requirements and transfer process.
- ⇒ Supplement curriculum with courses in political science, religion, anthropology, and classical civilizations.
- ⇒ JOB SHADOW and NETWORK WITH PROFESSIONALS in positions you wish to obtain.
- ⇒ Participate in campus clubs to gain **TEAMWORK** and **LEADERSHIP SKILLS**.
- ⇒ Practice interpersonal, small group and public speaking COMMUNICATION SKILLS.
- ⇒ Join PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION such as the American Sociological Association or the Association for Applied and Clinical Sociology to network and maintain current knowledge of opportunities in the field.

WHAT SKILLS DO I NEED?

- ⇒ Reading Comprehension understanding written sentences and paragraphs in work related documents.
- ⇒ Active Listening giving full attention to what other people are saying, taking time to understand the points being made, asking questions as appropriate, and not interrupting at inappropriate times.
- ⇒ **Social Perceptiveness** being aware of others' reactions and understanding why they react as they do.
- ⇒ Writing communicating effectively in writing as appropriate for the needs of the audience.
- ⇒ **Active Learning** Understanding the implications of new information for both current and future problem-solving and decision-making.

PREFERRED WORK STYLES INCLUDE:

- ⇒ Analytical Thinking analyzing information and using logic to address work-related issues and problems.
- ⇒ **Achievement/Effort** establishing and maintaining personally challenging achievement goals and exerting effort toward mastering tasks.
