3. Discussion Item

3.1 Scale of Adoption Assessment – Tenisha James

The Guided Pathways Scale of Adoption Assessment was presented. The pillars and practices of GP are designed to increase and improve equity, social mobility, and the economic health of our students and communities. When looking at the pillars, we are focused on ensuring students are learning, and ensure work is equity focused.

- **Pillar 1:** Clarify the path (mapping all programs to transfer and career). Highlights: website revisions and updates, edunav smart rule, course elective prioritization, trailhead/pathway updates.
- **Pillar 2:** Enter the path (integrated supports to give students the best start). Highlights: updated onboarding process that includes a new online orientation, and our Holistic Student Support Survey, launch of engagement center in 2019, expansion of dual enrollment
- **Pillar 3:** Stay on the Path (Keep students on track to ed/career goals). High lights: Edunav has supported the scaling of pillar practices, preparing to launch the Student Success Network 2022 (transitioning mustang mentors), working to build automation for Practice C in our ERP transition to anthology through automation and predicted student analysis.
- **Pillar 4:** Ensuring learning (enrich and assess student learning). Highlights: practice C: students have opportunity to apply knowledge. Practice F: the college helps students document their learning for employers and universities through portfolios and other means beyond transcripts.

Advancing Pillar 4

- Project Team racial and cultural competence. Racial justice taskforce classroom and campus experience, learning from the middle, SEA funded math community of proactive

Next STEP: Guided Pathways and Equity Work

- Seeking nominations for faculty coordinators to lead guided pathway and equity project teams, GP brown-bag series, anticipation of CCCCCO GP allocation.

Questions regarding the presentation included the topic of MAT 9. Specifically, how decisions are being made and communicated as not all campus constituents were aware that MAT 9 is coming through the pipeline.

3.2 Holistic Student Support Follow-up – David Schlanger

The council also received refresher on the holistic support survey. Discussion and questions asked include:

- 45% needing academic support stands out; LRC does not currently have manager support. It needs to be prioritized and institutionalized beyond grants
- Ongoing need to re-evaluate how we institutionalized the key things that students need. We are not equipped or ready to provide the services at scale.
- How do we adjust ourselves to be student ready?
- Basic needs manager will be in place in the Fall semester.
