1. Welcome

A. Dr. Parks welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2. Approve Minutes

Motion to approve minutes from March 10, 2017 with amendments | Zwart/Boelman approved with 2 abstentions

3. CRC Updates

A. Dr. Ocegüera would like the support from APC to remove the locks off the mailbox doors.

i. Current problems

- keys not being returned
- the cost of keys to needing to be cut each term
- eliminate the delay in getting faculty their keys

ii. Solutions

- may add labels
- will still have the central mail bucket
- CRC staff will still handle the mail

B. Dr. Ocegüera will be bringing in a shredding service

- there will be security boxes strategically placed around the college (CRC, IT 200, ATEC, etc...)
- for security, only the shredding service will have keys

C. Faculty Supplies

- Mr. Prior asked about faculty supplies, his concern is that the supplies are gone within a few hours of them being stocked.
- Dr. Ocegüera asked Eloy to check the stock more often and make sure supplies are available.

4. Old Business

A. 16-17 FTES status update

i. Dr. Parks distributed a current FTES spreadsheet

- Based on the current numbers, there is minimal change
- We expect Norco and Riverside to go down, but it will be minimal
- Moreno Valley will improve after the semester ends

B. 17-18 FTES update

i. The Chancellor called an emergency FTES meeting

- Norco was given their initial FTES numbers and requested they be modified to a more ideal number

- Norco has steady growth and predicted our ability to be about 7200 FTES
- Dr. Dieckmeyer negotiated 7051, which is believed to be a more manageable number
- ii. Approach to adding more FTES will have to be through partnerships
 - Numbers were broke down by college
 - The percentages will stay the same
 - Approach to adding FTES will have to be through partnership
 - Partnerships will take time to establish
 - Norco is right on target with projected growth
 - We need to expect to be asked to schedule extra (just in case)
 - We need Fall to be our biggest

C. Action Plan for Strategic Planning

- i. Melissa explained that APC is tasked with specific items from Dr. Aycocock's office as part of the Strategic Plan of the College
 - Covered the responsibilities of APC
 - a. Look at new ways of measuring, maybe this will tie into Completion Initiative
 - b. Worked on main clause, now we need to work on subordinate clause (scheduling conflicts)
 - i. Example of subordinate would be our degrees and programs
 - c. Room Utilization
 - i. Established a sub committee
 - d. CSU and UC charts updated
 - i. This is completed each term after scheduling is complete
 - e. The true number will be the degrees
 - f. Completion Initiative will play a huge role
 - Industry Partnerships
 - a. Partnerships have been increased
 - i. One example is the Industry breakfast
 - b. Internships
 - c. Colleen Molko emails updates monthly
 - Increase Data
 - a. We know data, FTES for example and we use it
 - b. Suggested that we use lowly enrolled times during the day
 - Improved Enrollment Dashboard
 - a. This is in the works and should be available soon. Dr. Zwart worked on the committee.
 - b. Consider more Saturday classes
 - c. English and Math move to a MWF schedule
 - Norco works hard to inform
 - Ensure resource Allocation
 - a. Look at how we are doing and plan
 - b. How are we using Summer and Winter
 - i. Summer Advantage
- ii. APC is doing a good job!

- iii. Melissa asked the committee if they would like to review the write up before she sends it to the Senate. The committee agreed to forward without their final review.

5. New Business

- A. Chair of Chair Election
 - i. Dr. Parks reviewed the responsibilities of the position
 - ii. Ana-Marie Olaerts nominated Melissa Bader
 - iii. Melissa accepted the nomination, but she has a concern about conflicts with other committees
 - She asked the other representatives of the Academic Senate that if she was not able to attend, would they on her behalf
 - They agreed
 - iv. Dr. Parks called for a vote
 - Melissa Bader was approved as the Chair of Chairs with no abstentions
- B. Organization of programs of study into schools
 - i. Completion Initiative
 - Departments need to determine where certificates and degrees will live
 - Peggy Campo sent out a Survey Monkey about this

5. Committee reports

- A. Academic Senate
 - i. Pathway Project including Tri-Tec, Nasa, Amazon
 - Norco is in
 - Each college gets 2 coaches and funding for the program
 - ii. The senate voted to discontinue mobile apps and Early Childhood Education Toddler
 - iii. OEI – will RCCD go this way
 - Senate voted yes to go in at the lowest level
 - The next level is Canvas and at this time Norco is the only college discussing it
 - a. Patty Worsham asked that we have a formal presentation of Canvas
 - b. Dr. Parks asked two questions
 - i. Do we want to participate in OEI
 - ii. Do we want to use Canvas
 - c. Dr. Parks recommended reaching out to Colleagues at other colleges that are using it for their input
 - The Senate has not seen an actual version of the program
 - The District is offering a Distance Education Conference on April 21
 - a. Patty Worsham will attend
 - iv. There are HR issues with filling hiring committees
 - Currently they track gender and Ethnicity
 - The Senate President needs to confirm that those things are known and the person establishing the committee needs to be trusted.
 - v. There is a correction to the sabbatical leave – you need to stay for two years
 - vi. Medina Bill discussion is on going
 - vii. Rex Beck was elected as the Faculty Speaker
 - Bob Prior and Quinton Bemiller will be the readers
 - viii. New Program review every three years

- ix. Update intervening year in TracDat
 - x. Certificate receivers get to walk at commencement if they have fully completed their certificate
 - They will not have a special designation
 - xi. Integrated Planning
 - There will be one plan with one budget
 - a. SSSP
 - b. BSI
- B. ISPC
- i. Technology Committee was sent the Prioritization List
 - ii. We are in the second phase of the computer refresh plan
 - At this time there is not a budget for it
 - Should be done every 4 to 6 years
 - iii. Budget Update
 - Stop having all of the money in growth
 - Governor is not releasing any money
 - iv. ASNC
 - Trustee at Norco has a representative Luis Velasco Rand
 - April 21, Silent Disco
 - v. Art History ADT was approved
 - vi. The District is all of us

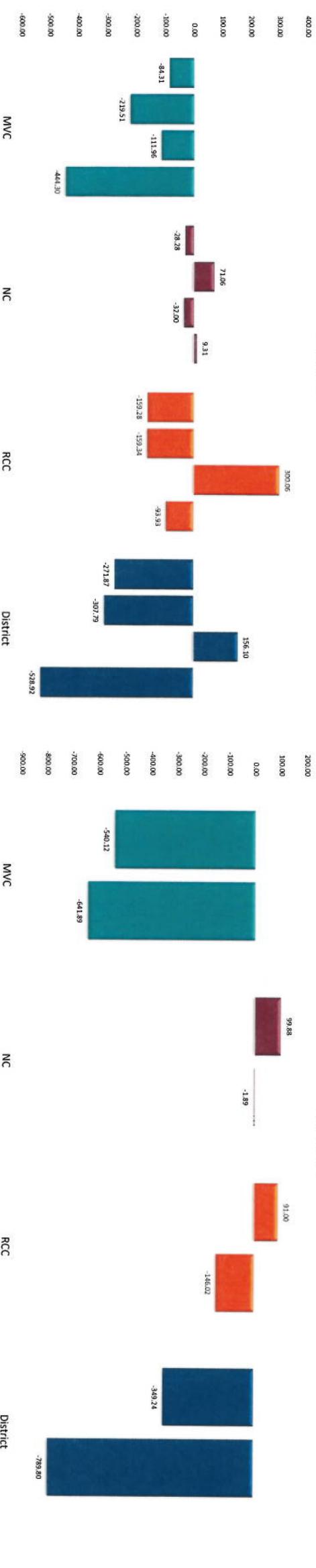

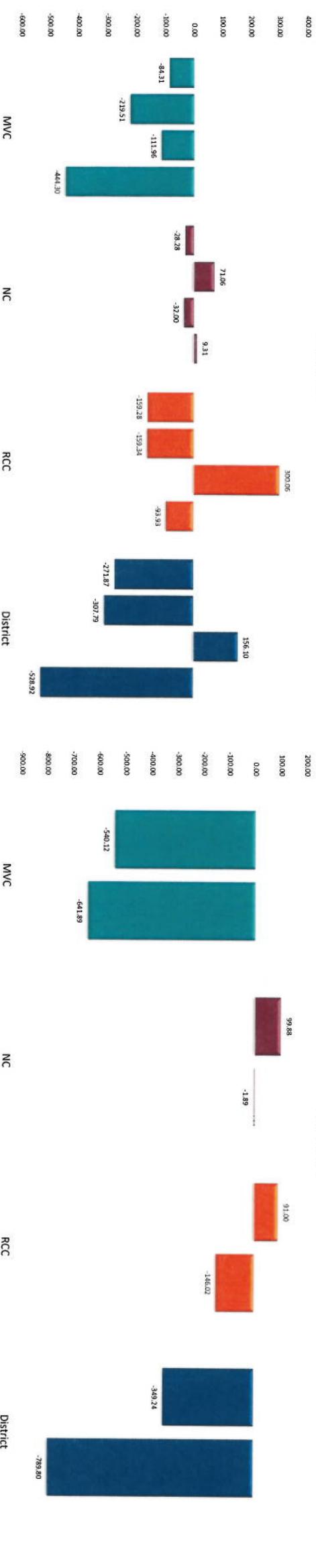

FTEs Difference from Target by Term by Site as of 04/06/17

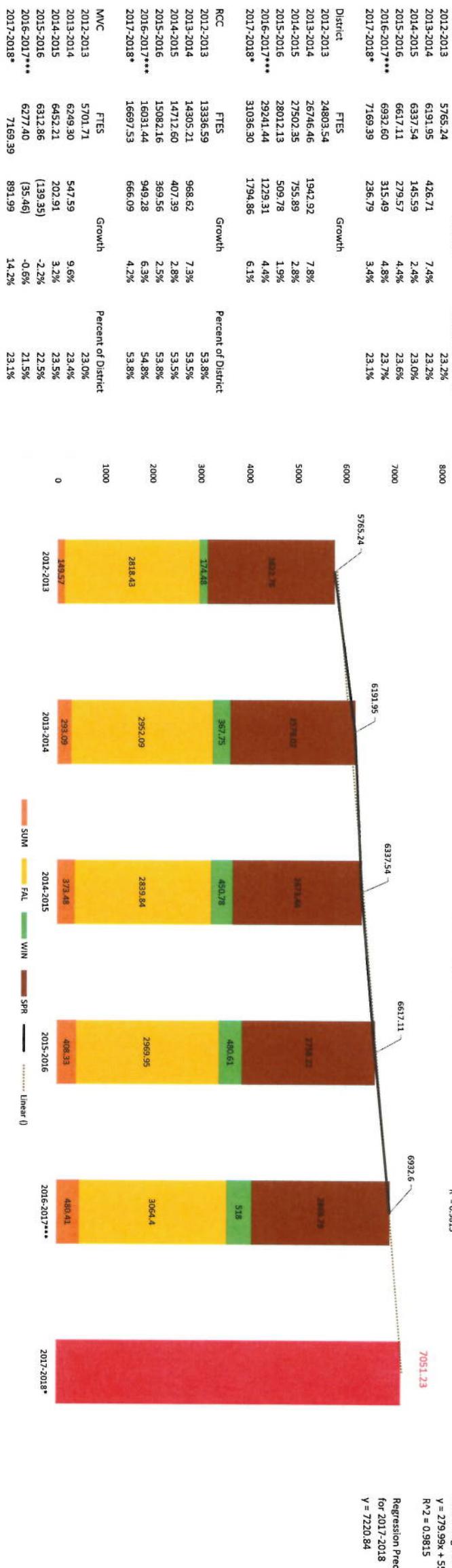


ANNUAL FTEs Difference from Target BEFORE and AFTER Summer Rollback as of 04/06/07
