A. Student Portal Demonstration – Information item (DeAsis)

Portal Review-Funded by Title V grant. The project started in 2012. Today's presentation is the very basic platform, our launching point.

- The fundamental concept is for a single sign on to access (WebAdvisor, Email, Office 365, etc).
- Built on Share Point
- Implementing pilot groups over the next two weeks. Please give feedback to your Norco Governance Team (Mark DeAsis).
- Use of portal does not eliminate access to any of the systems currently used. You can still access WebAdvisor, e-mail, etc. as individual program.
- Faculty/Staff component will begin in summer
- 25 students will be given "test" access at each college for fall registration.
- Portal is 508 compliant

IEPI Indicators Reviewed. Strategic Planning goals and IEPI Indicators are different. Today we are talking about the IEPI indicators; aspirational goals. On 4/6 the IEPI indicator targets were approved by the ISPC.

 up with 5-take ways.
- Moved forward with Brown Bag series that included:
 - o Meta Majors-A collection of academic and certificate majors that have related courses.
 - o Faculty Advisement Models- Instructional faculty that are mentors in their field of study.
 - o **Clear and Directed Pathways-**Students committed to specific pathways (we recently received a Guided Pathways grant!)
 - Linking College Work to Career Work Connecting students with industry experiences.
 - Student Mentoring; I Care Programs-Students want and need peer to peer mentoring
- Shared five steps at state Senate conference
