# Sen.11.14.01 Discuss the role of the Government Relations Office Motion Author: Marisa Yeager (Discussion Item)

Marisa Yeager, Director of Government Relations for RCCD will introduce herself and discuss partnership opportunities

- Motioned by Teresa, Seconded by Bryan.
- Director of Government Relations for the RCCD. She helps council members.
  - Our Assembly Member is Sabrina Cervantes.
- She is gathering evidence to show the Board of Trustees how much leadership we have on our campus.
  - This Tuesday, the board will decide on pursuing a bond that will cover 2 percent of property taxes on students.
- The entire palm walk way is freedom of speech and you can speak about any topic you want.
- Edwin: So every school has a different representative. Is that not the case anymore? The purpose of that is just, so all students have a representative that understands the problems in their campus.
- Edwin: So how can we advocate for something? So you could get in contact with me or with a board member/representative, and present your proposal.
