Campus Organizations

Gerlene Aquino: We decided on a name for the leadership conference. We are just waiting on a flyer; I do not have the exact date for that right now. We have decided on a guest speaker as well.

Executive

Angelica Calderon: I know you guys saw an email go out about campus opening in Fall. How do you guys feel about that? Yesterday I had an unofficial meeting with the other presidents from the college. We are all hearing different things and the district does not have the information set in place. I heard only 25% of class sizes can go in person. My concern was how are they going to select the students that do go in person. Some others were hearing 20/80. Some others are hearing 100%. They have not released an official statement. The district should have asked for student and faculty opinions before deciding that we are going back. It is because of budget issues. The district gets money depending on students attending classes. In my opinion they are rushing this, and they are not fully prepared. There is a vaccine but that too is not 100%. If someone does catch COVID, they are going to have to shut everything down and make everything online. My whole family caught

COVID, and I was the only one who did not get it. I was not able to be home and I had to stay with different family members. If we are all exposed to it, we would be bringing it back to our homes and it could affect them really bad. Right now, I feel like the district does not care about the students or faculty, all they care about is money.

Roman Zuniga: I am excited because of the opportunity, but I think we are going to have be careful. Say we do go back in person, how would we social distance if we have ASNC meetings or how would we stay safe?

Samia Irfan: It can be a little scary because of the vaccine. I do think it will be good for everyone though. It is important that we do have online classes because COVID will still be a thing and online classes should be available for people who are at high risk. When I went to the return to school task force, they cannot hire anyone to say this or that, so how are things going to be regulated. If we are using the guardian app, I do not want to go back because it is basically like an honors system. People can just lie and say they do not have symptoms. Now that we are talking about it, it does not seem like a good idea at all. We need to get the word out to people.

Edwin Romero: From my understanding, the plan is to be unrestricted and social distance if needed. It is hard to say what we can and cannot due. Come August we will know. If you guys are all the representatives at large, what concerns do you have when it comes to reopening. The plan is to also offer more online classes. A lot of students have been able to work more so would online classes be offered?

Gerlene Aquino: One of my biggest concerns is that there is a lot of students that work. If lectures would still be recorded or if attendance will be strict. A lot of people are just trying to make ends meet considering a lot also lost their jobs.

Tami Ajayi: What about class sizes and mask use in the coral? I feel like it is too soon to be going back. I am a therapist and I got COVID. They did not disclose that to me and then I was giving it to everyone. It got intense and I had to go to the hospital. I know exactly how that is, but I still am not able to go back to work. They had our sessions strictly online, and some of the clients wanted to go back into person and that is when I caught it. If they were to put vaccinations into the equation how would that work?

Rochelle Duran: I take a lab once a week, but there is protocol. They provide hand sanitizer and we do not have lab partners. We use the guardian app, and it is advised that if you have some symptoms to not go.

Anisha Solhotra: So, a part of me wants to go back onto campus, but something that is getting to me is if someone does have COVID. If someone has COVID what is going to happen. How would those processes work if someone does have COVID? Grades would drop and be affected. There is a lot of complications with going back onto campus. I wanted to mention that we have spaces like this so our voices can carry because it does hold weight. It is hard because we are not in person, so I just wanted to say and reinforce that we can say our honest opinions because this is where we shape and mold our student and campus. It is clear that money is the issue, and it is about capitalism. It is more than that and we should say something.

Michael Moreno: Anisha hit it right on the spot. It is concerning. I am transferring but hopefully the university will be prepared, and I will be more comfortable attending classes in person. I do want answers from Norco College.

Makenna Ashcraft: I agree with what Anisha said. I would love to go back but the protocols will not be enough. I got really sick in 2019 and then Angie got sick, and it is like a domino effect.

Ryan Snyder: All of California is in the red tier right now. It is risky to go back to school. I think we should wait til things do get a lot better. School would be good to reopen if circumstances were better than they are now.

Arielle Benas: I feel like they should conduct a survey to see if student do want to go back or if they do not want to go back. Also, if we do go back in person, do students have the option to not go in person if they are not comfortable.

Tharek Phounsavat: My biggest concern is if we are going to be able to do online. I agree with Arielle about the survey. It was apparent that our school was not prepared for online, and I also do not think we are prepared to back in person. It is much smarter and safer to perfect the blueprint of going back in person.

Isaac Nuñez: I think Tharek stated this, that we should wait and see how other schools are doing first. Education should come first before store opening and all that other stuff.

Academic Senate

Angelica Calderon: We discussed on the return of being on campus. A lot of the staff had concerns and were very strongly opinionated. Many said it was negative. One of them said that we should start with hybrid classes instead of fully going back in person. Another student mentioned that students have had to step up in their households. There is a lot of factors that come in to play. They have students were confused about if they had to attend zoom or not. One professor mentioned that the email going out with no answers, students are going to be scared away and they are not going to want to register for classes.

ISBC

Angelica Calderon: As you guys know we have a calendar for the meetings that happen regularly. There was discussion about having the same calendar but setting aside a certain day during college hour where we cannot hold events and just to hold meetings. My concern was that it was going to restrict out events.

Isaac Nuñez: Students know every Tuesday and Thursday there is college hour, and they go to their club meetings and then go to their next lecture. Only way this would work is if they set aside one Tuesday for that so we can attend those meeting.
