Sen.03.25.01 Allocate \$10,000 From ASNC Leadership Conferences (92719) to go Towards Travel to the National Championship in Texas for the Rugby Team.

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote on funding to send the Rugby team to Texas for their National Championship.

- Our rugby team is undefeated and has qualified for the College Championship in Texas in about a month. The team is fundraising to try and help raise money for the entire trip which will be about \$16,800. The request is for travel funds. \$4,000 would have been set aside for an end of the year banquet, but they have set this aside to focus on this championship. If Texas is a state that we are not allowed to travel to, then the money would come back and not be used.

The building will be completed and ready by possibly 2025.

Campus Organizations

- A volunteer sheet was made as well as a club activity form to be filled out for the Easter Egg event. This will be sent in the GroupMe for us to put our names down. This event has not been approved yet, but is in progress.

President

- Advises VPs to find successors and training other people to send them into bigger positions.
- Encourages the senate groups to apply for these positions and wants to see us all grow
