VI. New Business:

Senate 05.22.01 Approval of \$1200 from ASNC Campus Activities (92212) to Upgrade the CSS Second Floor Charging Station

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote upon the allocation of \$1200 from ASNC Campus Activities to upgrade the charging station on the second floor of the Center for Student Services. This item follows the authorization granted under Senate 05.01.05 to examine the station for potential upgrading.

Discussion:

Justin: I am a manufacturing technician, and I am proposing to upgrade the charging station. Nobody ever said the charging station is good, the current state of the charger is bad because it is only 5 volts and devices need 30 volts to charge efficiently. The current charger was made in 2019,, and it is outdated and doesn't support power delivery. The solution is to go big or go home! The SIIG 16-port 1000w industrial charging station has 16 ports. The old 5v would have taken 3.5 hours to charge my phone, but the new one would take 20 minutes. The charging station is \$500 and the cables are \$416; cable management is \$49. I propose to upgrade the wheels since it is hard to move around, which would cost \$30. Budget total is \$1200. The current budget provides a buffer for an insufficient power strip. This includes spare parts; I think it is good to have spare parts. It is a lot of money, but you should think about what you are getting in return. If you approve it now, we would be spending less than if we were to do it later next year because of tariffs.

Hussam: Is the newer charging going to fit?

Justin: It will fit either inside or on the door.

Hussam: Don't they usually have the dimensions listed on the charging port? Can you please provide us with the dimensions.

Justin: I can get the dimensions for you but I'm very sure it will fit.

Tristan: I think it's very beneficial for the school and we have the money for it, so why not.

Justin: Each of the 8 lockers in the station have one charging port, the new solutions provide 16 ports.

Hussam: Is there a reason why you went with the 16 ports?

Justin: People may have more devices to charge.

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Kennan: Will the chargers only be USB-C?

Justin: I plan to come back to purchase adapters for other ports, but I just wanted to get this approved first.

Kennan: Yeah, that was one of my concerns since a lot of people still have the lightning cable port.

Jared: Do you have an expected date for project completion?

Justin: I would imagine the work only takes one day, maybe two. But the only reason I'd estimate an additional day is because I must drill holes into the chassis.

Senate 05.22.02 Bill 05-2026, Amendment to Elections Code: Updated and Clarified Election Code

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote upon this bill. This bill proposes amendments to Article I, Sections 3, 4, 5, and 7, and Article II, Section h of the Elections Code. Changes include adding "at minimum" language to election day scheduling and allowing the election committee to designate further times, adding an "unless contested" qualifier to the results posting timeline, replacing "election packets" with "election applications" throughout, and removing the 200-signature and class schedule requirements from application submissions.

Dr. Romero: I don't have the updated bills.

Ethan: So, this one should be the same, I will send out the other three.

Ethan: So, there is a lot that's being changed in bill 5, but nothing substantial. Mainly the wording is being changed. Elections are very digital now. What I'm doing for bill 5 is just changing the wording. It's just to give the next elections committee more leeway. We don't ask people to get signatures for anymore, it's just tedious. Dr. Romero now has the ability to see people's classes, so a schedule isn't needed.

Senate 05.22.03 Bill 06-2026, Amendment to Elections Code: Campaign Material Fairness

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The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote upon this bill. This bill proposes amendments to Article II, Section k of the Elections Code. Changes redefine the \$200 spending cap to apply to equipment only, introduce an election committee-funded allowance for campaign materials, prohibit candidates from using personal funds on campaign materials, and ban cash giveaways, raffles, and other non-guaranteed distributions to voters.

Ethan: This is basically your Air pod/ Raffle clause. Anything that is underlined is what's added. Each candidate has a \$75 limit for campaign material. In my opinion this should be passed now, any changes can be made by future ASNC.

Senate 05.22.04 Bill 07-2026, Amendment to Elections Code: Defined Photo Code

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote upon this bill. This bill proposes amendments to Article I, Section 7 of the Elections Code. Changes establish photo submission standards for candidate applications, requiring business casual or formal attire, a well-lit full-frontal face, torso-up cropping, and that only the candidate appear in the photo.

Discussion:

Ethan: This is your bathroom photo clause. Photo should be clear, with business casual attire, should be cropped from torso and end slightly above the head. Only the candidate should be visible in the picture.

Bobby: Why does it have to be like business casual?

Ethan: When we wrote this, we had no requirement for what people should wear. It's to present a better face for ASNC.

Bobby: I just feel some people may not have access to a suit or a dress.

Ethan: Do you think it should be more casual wear then?

Bobby: Well, I was just asking for clarification since I wasn't sure what you meant by business casual.

Hussam: Also, worst case scenario, ASNC has old polos in the storage which we can utilize for future candidates that need them.

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Ashley: Basic Needs also has polos that we can use.

Ethan: There was a candidate that had a bathroom photo.

Ashley: Does that mean that the photos that the candidates send will be approved ahead of time by the Elections Committee?

Ethan: Yes.

**Senate 05.22.05 Bill 08-2026, Amendment to Elections Code: Enforceable Election Code

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote upon this bill. This bill proposes amendments to Article I, Sections 5(f) and 6 of the Elections Code. Changes grant the election committee discretion to designate reasonable distance requirements around voting booths, add disqualification as the explicit penalty for proximity violations, and clarify that candidates may enter the voting booth area once to cast their own vote.

Discussion:

Ethan: We recognized that the 10 feet rule that we implemented was just not possible. We would must have the elections committee follow everyone around. The 10 feet is a standard, but elections committee can decide if they want to go through with this rule.

**Senate 05.22.06 Bill 09-2026, Amendment to Elections Code: Candidate Group Ticket
Regulation

(Action Item)**

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote upon this bill. This bill proposes a new Section m under Article II of the Elections Code. The new section explicitly outlines candidate endorsements and formal tickets, caps group tickets at a maximum of two candidates, and requires candidates to notify the election committee of ticket arrangements prior to voting days.

Discussion:

Ethan: This is our regulation on tickets. Basically, when we wrote this, we thought that we shouldn't have candidates choose their team. They should be running to run for yourself. The maximum number of candidates on a ticket should only be 2.

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Adishvar: So, this doesn't prohibit, say, four people from going up to one person and asking for their vote?

Ethan: I don't think that's enforceable. You know how you guys had 6 people on your ticket so that's what we were thinking about when we wrote this.

Ashley: 2 candidates on a ticket might be small, it can be 3 or 4 since we are limiting how much money they can use. Since we already talked about funding, and we approved the amount on how much they can spend, it already evens the playing field. Tickets can be a liability if it is not organized well and doesn't always have to be a win.

Ethan: I think that the reason why we're making this is to lower the gap of being required /having to be on a ticket and running individually.

Ashley: Tickets aren't always a win.

Ethan: Say with 8 executive candidates, 6 people get together, they've just chosen their future team. The two who run alone are at a disadvantage, making it practically impossible for them to win.

Bobby: I think 2 is fine. Having around 6 people on a ticket makes their chances of winning very high compared to running alone.

Adishvar: If 2 people are allowed to be on a ticket, with a \$150 limit (\$75 each), there's still a financial advantage there.

Ethan: But remember from the last amendment, there is a cap of \$75 dollars per person. Can you give me an example of how this would give them an advantage?

Adishvar: An example is if you are on a ticket and putting up a poster, you can put up double the number of posters with the increased budget, and if tickets are preapproved and capped at \$75, it wouldn't affect the budget. If we're going to limit tickets at 2, there cap should stay the same.

Ethan: Ok so is this something that we can add on to the item, or should we just change the amendment.

Adishvar: If you were going to do that, there would be a different process to do it, but I think it will require changes to this amendment and clarifications on the funding one as well. Honestly, it would be too complex to do right now.

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Senate 05.22.07 Bill 10-2026, Amendment to Elections Code: Social Media Regulation

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote upon this bill. This bill proposes amendments to Article II, Section h of the Elections Code. Changes replace "campaign materials" with "promotional materials," require materials to accurately and clearly state the candidate's name, position, polling dates, and voting method, limit promotional photos to the candidate and their ticket partner, require election committee verification before posting online or on campus, and define promotional materials to include flyers, posters, social media posts, and social media accounts.

Discussion:

Ethan: All candidates should clearly state their name, position they are running for, current election polling sites, and current method to vote in election.

Jared: Let's say I'm running and I have a booth, how am I supposed to tell people where the booth is, if it has to be two days in advance?

Ethan: Maybe we can change it to 1 day but the reason why we are doing this is because we don't want to be printing everyone's flyers the day before or the day of.

Jared: But still, people would want to know where my booth is. It has to be approved two days before?

Ethan: I see what you mean, I can definitely add a distinction between social media and printed flyers.

Ashley: I was going to say maybe we can make it so it's just printing

Motion to Amend: "Promotional Material" to "Physical Promotional Material"
