Ishmael: Choir's President; The importance of uniforms was brought up since a lot of students can't afford them themselves. For events, it's important that everyone looks professional and matches because it helps the image of the group. Students were asked to wear uniforms on Wednesday for the orchestra performance, and there will also be a concert next Friday where uniforms will be needed again. Having uniforms helps everything look more organized and professional instead of uncoordinated. Other groups on campus already do this too, like ASNC with their denim shirts and MOC with their shirts. Because of this, were asking for a small amount of funding to help cover the uniforms.

Cole: We zeroed out choir's budget line because Choir only spent 32 dollars on the budget in 2024-25 year for uniform money. Because of the inconsistency in the spending, we zeroed out the budget to free up that money. You can still get money for the uniforms, but it would have to be through exec.

Ishmael: What do you mean? We would come back to contingencies to ask for money?

Dr. Romero: ASNC has already approved some funds this year that won't be expended until next year. I ask you guys to make a motion to increase 3 of the budgets, so next year's budget isn't impacted. A trip to New York was approved with \$3,000 total funding, including \$1,000 from Honors and \$2,000 from Executive Contingency, which will be spent in July. Because of

this, the budget would need to be increased by \$3,000. If the funds are not used for the trip, they will be held for future use. Senate 05.22.06 Bill 09-2026, Amendment to Elections Code: Candidate Group Ticket Regulation

(Action Item)

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote upon this bill. This bill proposes a new Section m under Article II of the Elections Code. The new section explicitly outlines candidate endorsements and formal tickets, caps group tickets at a maximum of two candidates, and requires candidates to notify the election committee of ticket arrangements prior to voting days.

“Any physical promotional material featuring bot ticket candidates shall be assessed at retail value and counted against each candidate’s individual campaign material budget as outlined in Article II §k. Any resources provided by the Associated Students of Norco College or the Elections Committee, including but not limited to printed materials, that

feature both ticket candidates shall count against each candidate's individual resource allocation. Ticket candidates may not pool or combine their individual campaign material allowances or resource allocations."

Adishvar: As you guys know, this bill was originally introduced to prevent the large tickets we saw in this year's election cycle. The bill does this by cutting the max ticket size down to two. However, the bill doesn't remove the financial advantages of a ticket. Between two people, you still have a budget of \$150 as opposed to \$75 for an individual candidate. This amendment aims to remove that financial advantage. It does so by making it such that any physical promotional, be it bought or provided by ASNC, with both candidates of a ticket advertised, is counted toward both individual's expenditure cap and resource allocation. For example, if a ticket prints a banner with both members advertised for \$10, that will be \$10 out of both individual's \$75 cap. Essentially, it counts twice, once each member advertised. As for ASNC provided resources, in the past election, with each candidate being able to print 100 quarter sheet flyers from the office. A ticket of 6 people was able to print 600 flyers with each candidate advertised on each one. If this amendment was not passed, then next year, tickets could replicate this on a smaller scale with say, 200 flyers that advertise you (and your ticket partner) instead of just 100 for yourself. The amendment prevents this. Say a ticket asks to print 50 quarter sheets of combined flyers; 50 sheets would be deducted from the allocation of both candidates appearing on the flyer, leaving each with 50. To summarize, you'd never be able to have more than 100 ASNC provided flyers advertising yourself; I believe this to be much fairer.

development and esports programs since many schools are starting to cut these types of clubs, and they have already noticed this happening at local high schools.

They shared that high school students attending the event will be able to learn how to make Fortnite maps and work together by sharing files and making edits collaboratively. Guest speakers from esports will also be attending. Roshan Uma will speak about how esports programs are run. They also mentioned a guest connected through their advisor, Chad Van Wye, who attended Norco College, has worked on projects related to Fallout 3 and trophy design.

ICC has already approved part of the budget for catering and other event costs. They are requesting \$2,500 for a 6 x 11 ft LED light panel, which is the remaining amount after sponsors and a \$1,500 discount. They also shared that part of the event will include a raffle for a Nintendo Switch 2.

Bobby: Are you set on having a LED wall panel or would you guys be open to having a projector? Would the projector be cheaper than the LED panel?

Joseph: They are the same price

Sil: you don't have 2k (the video game)

Aj: Well, I feel like I have to ask this question as a stem club officer; why are you taking money from Stem, do they not have any future plans for them?

Dr. Romero: I talked to Cambry and the stem club is not holding any events, so we are taking out money from them to fund the LED lights.
