
How to Link Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs) to an Existing Assignment:


1. Once you have an assignment set up in Canvas, outcomes can now be linked. To start, find and select the assignment in Canvas. The assignment details page should appear as shown in the image below.




Note:

- Do not do this if you are working in a Canvas Master Development Shell; you will want to wait until you are working in an actual course.
- Quizzes at this time are not encouraged to be used for Norco College Assessment purposes.


2. Select the "+ Create Rubric" icon.




3. Select the "Create From Outcome" icon.



4. This will open a new screen and from this screen you will click on the PLO option that corresponds with your program(s).



- 5. Identify the appropriate PLO that you would like to link to the assignment and click "Import."
 - a. Review the outcome statement to verify alignment with the assignment content.
 - Best Practice: Put the PLO(s) on the assignment.




- c. Review the assessment rubric, if needed. The rubric is standardized for all PLOs throughout Norco College and must be used to allocate assessment scores.
 - Best Practice: Start thinking about your plan to interpret student learning attainment (using the shared 0-4 assessment rubric) based on the Instructor's grading practices.
 - ii. Note: The assessment rubric and PLO(s) scores will be visible to students. Follow the "work-around" as an alternative method to remove from student view:
 - 1. Work Around: To remove assessment rubric and results from student view first create a mirrored assignment, valued at 0 pts, in an unpublished module. Then link PLO(s) to that assignment instead of the original "graded" version.
 - 2. Work Around-Future Step: Later, when grading the assignment in Speedgrader, open the mirrored assignment/assessment in another window and assign assessment score at the same time.
 - 3. PLEASE NOTE: In response to Faculty Feedback as described in the Faculty Feedback Plan, NAC is currently in the process of researching an improved method to remove assessment results from student view. This work around is the interim solution.




- d. Next, decide whether the assessment rubric will be used to allocate assessment scores ONLY or if it will also be used to allocate assignment grades for students.
 - i. If the rubric will NOT be used to assign student grades, then you will not need to do anything else, and you will move on to the next step.
 - ii. If you WOULD like to use this rubric to assign students grades, then you will need to select that option by selecting the "Use this rubric for assignment grading."
 - 1. If selected, 0-4 points will be awarded towards the assignment grade based on the assessment score result selected on the rubric when grading.


e. Next, review the calculation method to verify the desired selection is listed. For guidance on calculation methods see Guidance Document: Calculation Methods




6. Once the outcome(s) have been identified select the "Import" icon towards the lower right to link with the assignment.



- 7. Back on the assignment rubric screen finalize the rubric by customizing the remaining options:
 - a. Add a Title
 - b. Add additional criterion to the rubric or "Add other outcomes."



8. Once you have everything you would like on the rubric, select the "Create Rubric" icon to finalize and save.



NOTE:

- a. <u>Do NOT select: "I'll write free-form comments when</u> assessing students," because it will remove the common 0-4 rubric scale.
- b. <u>Do NOT select: "Remove points from rubric" because it will</u> remove the common 0-4 rubric scale.
- c. Select "Don't post Outcomes results to Learning Mastery Gradebook" if and only if you do not wish to include the assessment in the final assessment results.
- d. Select "Use the rubric for assignment grading," if desired.
 - i. Selecting this will auto-populate each student's grade by clicking a score on the rubric while grading in speed grader.
- e. <u>Do NOT select: "</u>Hide score total from assessment results," because it will remove the common 0-4 rubric scale.
