- 1. ### SHORT DESCRIPTION of PROGRAM

Businesses and other organizations depend on complex electronic equipment for a variety of functions. Industrial controls automatically monitor and direct production processes on the factory floor. Transmitters and antennae provide communication links for many organizations. Industry needs well-trained technicians with the knowledge of how to design, repair and implement new equipment. The Industrial Automation program teaches how to use Electronics, Programmable Logic Control and Fluid Power systems to create and program new machinery used in industry. This certificate prepares students for employment as an automated systems technician, maintenance mechanic, general maintenance worker, or electro-mechanical technicians.

# PROGRAM LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of this program, students should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate the installation maintenance and troubleshooting of Programmable Logic Control systems (PLCs) or Variable Frequency Drives (VFD) PLC modules.

- 3. Establish a systematic approach to recognizing the essential information given on a blueprint.

#### SHORT DESCRIPTION of PROGRAM

The Music Industry Studies certificate is a program designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary for studio recording and live performance in the commercial music industry. Classes are taught utilizing industry-standard software and equipment in state-of-the-art facilities. This program prepares students for a wide variety of careers as: instrumentalists, vocalists and audio engineers in studio or live performance settings.
