O. Discussion items:
a. Early Enrollment impact on college course catalog. Brian attended a meeting to discuss the options on how early enrollment can be done and what changes need to be made. Dr. Lee spoke about the goal is to allow students to register early by two terms or more. West Kern College has been doing it for two years now. The goal is to do a one year registration. The VP's were looking to do an early registration of one year by April 2020. In April 2019 Norco college will open registration to have a WIN/SPR2019 and SUM/FAL20. The issue is when we have to finish the catalog in order to do multiple registration. Right now, to start with SUM/FAL combination and then WIN/SPR combo, but the issue is when we need to finish the catalog in order to have multiple terms registration. At one point, we must freeze the catalog. In order to
make that happen we would need to create a two year course catalog (2020-2022). So we need an April 19, 2019 is the deadline in order to prepare for a two year course catalog. The deadline to submit new courses is April 2019. Then to create a course catalog every other year. Any revisions will be reflected in the catalog addendums but we need to determine what we will allow. For example, new programs can be applied as long as it doesn't impact an existing program that a student is already registered in. Chaffee is currently doing two terms at a time, and is moving towards a year so this is possible.
b. Curriculum chair nomination for the next two years. The nominations take place on May $8^{\text {th }}$ and the final vote is May $22^{\text {nd }}$.

The curriculum committee is also responsible for keeping abreast with state mandated curriculum changes and reporting those changes to faculty. Committee members report on curriculum at their department meetings and solicit suggestions and recommendations when needed.
