Information Items

1. Strategic Planning Kickoff (Bryan Reece)

Dr. Reece shared the timeline for the next strategic plan 2018-2023 reviewing the core idea of the strategic plan and the need to have everyone involved in the process. (Attachment)

2. 1.6M Proposal (Bryan Reece)

Growth money is available, now is the time to grow and if we do, it is likely we will be eligible for growth money. As we are growing, we need to think strategically ways to grow that meet our mission and have some margin. This means growing in ways that will add money for our other growth needs. Dr. Reece reviewed each program, citing some potential pros and cons. (Attachment)

Questions/Comments:

- In terms of revenues we get for growth, will the revenue come in time to keep these people employed?
 - O It will take one year and a half to catch up with costs; we might need to carry them for six months. The FTES offset the costs, Jim has been running some good models to cover the costs, and new hires are similar to grants, guaranteed as part of the employment agreement. The proposal is for the equivalent of full time staff with three directors, one for each program and equivalent staff for A&R services.
- Is there money for safety related issues included in the budget for emergency preparedness? There is no sidewalk to WEQ from the front of the campus to avoid walking through parking lots.
 - There is a component of the emergency preparedness budget for safety related projects however; one of this size would need major planning and renovation.
- Talking about space, hybrid classes at night have a higher fill rate, for every conventional class we can put two hybrid classes.
 - o Yes, we would like to pursue that idea.

- Is there a budget for mental health services within the Veterans initiative?
 - We are looking to partner with Loma Linda VA clinic and Corona Vets Center to collaborate on a Veterans clinic in the new VRC.
- For the Prison Program do the FTES include Counseling Services? For counseling, someone who understands what they can do when they get out and what careers are open to them is very important.
