## **Pathway Development Progress**

- Approximately 30 institutions attended Pathways Institute #1 9/17 9/17
- Ms. Bader shared the pillars of guided pathways and the key elements to guided pathways information
- IEPI funding will be allocated to the college from the state; the timeline is November 1 with board approval.
  - The group discussed the following ideas regarding the completion initiative:
    - Maintain a sense of urgency about the completion initiative.
    - Make sure we are scaling the entire institution
    - o Offer 8 to 9 classes in each school to choose from to get the student in the right path
    - o Keep asking students to find out what their needs are
    - Pathways and completion initiative should be integrated as a whole call it *college* completion initiative
    - Assume students don't know which way they want to go and assist them with a pathway.
    - o Focus on students second year educational plan, not only the first year
    - Have students register in the spring for the fall semester so they can be committed to continue with their education
    - Focus on marketing to students
    - There are things we can do institutionally and change the way we do things. Opting
      in versus opting out like organ donors would be a good practice. You have a choice
      to opt out instead of the opposite.
    - Make things automatic for students, like graduation
    - Focus on the students that are not sure what they want and need; 80% of Norco College students are 19 years old and under; figure out how we can help them to get be on tract and on a pathway
    - Students need to be clear on the impact it would have on their completion plans if they don't take four classes
    - Many students are unware of the educational plan or that they can see a counselor to help them elaborate on their educational plan.
    - It's crucial to inform students about the units they need to be able to complete their degree in two years
    - o Focus on a plan for students for their educational plan for the first year
    - → The college is planning to apply for a grant that will give us funds on getting more students to attend college and assist them getting through college. The project is a grant that will help the faculty with educational advising
    - Develop success teams that can be tied to a learning community
    - → Maintain contact with students and use more technology; set up social media to reach out to students
    - Obtain and use data to identify who are the most at-risk students
    - Talk with students for an hour on welcome day to guide them at the beginning of the semester, or once a month per school
    - o The trail heads and AOE's will be finalized this year
    - We want students to transfer and get their degree at the same time
    - Ad Hoc committee is working on a calendar of events for presentation at the next meeting

**ACTION:** Jethro will bring the AOE's to the next meeting.

## **College to Career Linkages**

- For better advertisement and marketing the different schools
- Jethro presented a flyer that all the schools used on Welcome Day

#### **Faculty Advisement Model**

- Dr. Aycock will create survey for 18SPR to measure the usage and effectiveness of faculty advising
- A mass email to students listing all the schools we have on campus is needed

#### **Models of Student Care**

- · Art and Humanities held mentors interviews and hired two students
- STEM will also interview two students
- Each school will hire and will receive train two (2) mentors
- A completion initiative email or newsletter needs to be created to disseminate information
- There are about 3,000 student in GradGuru available to promote the schools to students
- Classroom faculty can advise students to see a faculty advisor
- We need to go to students instead of them looking for us
- Have one full-time counselor in charge of one team or a certain amount of students to coordinate on evaluating the students that need guidance
