3. Information/Discussion Items

3.1 New LSP Librarian (Vivian Harris)

- Dr. Hayley Garcia Ashby is the new full-time LSP Librarian at Norco College
- Provided an overview of her educational and professional background

3.2 Spring 2021 Read 2 Succeed (Damon Nance)

- Spring 2020 Read 2 Succeed postponed until Fall and transitioned to online
- Spring 2021 Read 2 Succeed continues the focus on social justice and equity with A Question of Freedom: A Memoir of Learning, Survival, and Coming of Age by Dwayne Betts
- Suggested by Lisa Nelson, English Professor who teaches ENG 1B at Norco College and at the prison (trying to find a way for them to participate given limited access to technology)
- Current registration shows that 24 people have signed up, but the library is hoping for a larger online audience (50-60 people)
- Email blast was just sent out to students; market to your classes/students

- When the event was in-person with the author, CSS 217 was filled (goal is 75-100 people)
- Reached out ASNC to see if they could provide incentives; ASNC will
 provide four \$25 MasterCard gift cards through the bookstore (need to
 provide student info to them)
- Students will facilitate the panel discussions focusing on the topic; assumes people may not have read the book; generate interest in reading the book
- Fall 2021 Semester still open, so let Damon know if you have an idea;
 \$3,000 budget for speakers; virtual format in Fall 2021
- FLEX credit available if you submit an individual plan; Vivian can provide guidance on proof for FLEX

3.3 Library Closure & Repair (Damon Nance)

- Library has water damage to carpet, cabinetry, wall, and ceiling due to issues with previously installed rain gutters
- Archives and the library collection were not damaged
- Major construction required and repairs will take all of Spring 2021 into Summer 2021; should be ready to reopen in Fall 2021
- No access to the library is currently permitted
- Before the building was closed in February, Damon retrieved zero-cost textbook sets for some classes including Early Childhood Education and Administration of Justice; textbooks, laptops, and hotspots are stored down in the faculty offices

3.4 2021-2022 LRC Budget Projection (Daren Koch)

- Built upon the assumption that the audience read the Library and LRC plan which has had a first and second read in Academic Senate
- Requesting a little over \$200,000 for tutoring support
- Schedule for Summer 2021 through Spring 2022 shows number of tutors and weekly hours (assumes online for Summer 2021 and 4-10s schedule)
- Budget for 40 tutors at \$16 per hour includes overall cost and equity training costs (projected need \$213,824)
- Funding sources include general fund and federal work study (\$48,000)
- Projected need based on Fall 2019 is higher than what was requested in the program review due to continuation of online tutoring at admin's request and increased wage (\$2/hour increase)

3.5 Embedded Tutoring Alignment with Strategic Goals (Daren Koch)

- Identifies targets for embedded tutoring and study groups
- Aligned with Strategic Planning Goal 3, Objective 3.1-3.5 (equity) and Goal
 7, Objective 7.7 (student success)
- Dr. Hitchcock provided training on microaggressions

- Black Minds Matter CORA Training and Certification; one student who will work with Dr. Hitchcock to develop a guide for tutor's
- Increase of 10% in student success rate when using tutoring services;
 success data is disaggregated by ethnicity
- True impact of tutoring controlling for prior academic performance shows a 6.5% increase in success (64.9% v. 71.4%), which exceeds acceptable rate
- GPA distribution comparison, controlling for prior academic performance, shows improvement
- True effect of embedded tutoring and study groups controlling for course, instructor, and class schedule (same course, same instructor, same time of day offered):
 - MAT-65 12.19% increase
 - ENG-80 10.24% increase
- The committee approved sending the budget projection forward to Academic Senate by consensus
- Vivian Harris will submit the form to be placed on the agenda for the March 15th Academic Senate meeting

4. Good of the Order

- The Administrative Assistant position for the LRC, which has been vacant since October 2020, has been recommended for hire
- Reduced from a full-time to 18 hours/week due to end of categorical funding
- LRC workload necessitates a full-time position; need to determine the best way to advocate for this
