1.3 Spring 2021 Read 2 Succeed Author Event & Fall 2021 Book Selection (Damon Nance)

- Dwayne Betts (author) will be with us on May 27th at 12:30
- Faculty and staff are showing up to the events, but we need more students to attend
- Please encourage students to attend

- We have been getting about 20 people attend the events online; the goal is to have about 50 attendees; in-person Read2Succeed events were well attended with about 120 participants
- The book for the Fall will be *The How of Happiness* by Sonia Lyubomirsky recommended by Miguel Castro; author is a full-time faculty member at UCR
- The selection took into consideration feedback asking for an upbeat topic
- The author is willing to appear online or in person
- If social distancing is required, we can have an in-person event and also stream to other locations on campus; also arrange to have books signed by the author as that is one benefit of attending the event
- Faculty asked to share at department meetings and offer extra credit for attendance

1.4 Library Closure & Repair Update (Damon Nance)

- Hayley Ashby attended the BFPC Meeting this morning and Steven Marshall provided an update:
 - Library shelving will be removed once construction is complete
 - Additional electrical has been added
 - Window seal replacement completed
 - Sound proofing has been installed to improve the study space
 - Drywall is up, and mudding and painting is underway
 - Progress is happening at an astonishing rate
 - End of June is the projected date for reopening, but it could be completed before that
 - Damon Nance will be meeting with Steven Marshall next week and will follow up with him on the second-floor study space and other details

1.6 Laptop & Hotspot Loan Program Update

- About 50 hotspots were recalled and will be switched out with replacements; students were asked to return the recalled units and service will be switch off
