3.3 Associated Students of Norco College (ASNC) Donation for Reserve Textbooks

- \$10,000 purchase order at the bookstore for the library
- Willing to commit to up to \$30,000 to build up the reserve collection
- Moving to 21-day checkout for textbooks (discussed with ASNC)
- Thinking of purchasing multiple copies of popular textbooks
- Cost prohibitive to contract with textbook copies for electronic versions, but the library will continue to look at options
- HEERF funding used to purchase sterilizing machine for books, laptops, and other circulating items
- ASNC has additional funds to support student needs Damon would like to submit a proposal for study room furniture near the low reference area; ASNC representative will take it back to Edwin
- ASNC is looking to set up funds for students who cannot afford textbooks
- The LRC has some textbooks
- Concern over accessibility if 21-day check out for the textbooks and they are first come first serve

- Library and LRC is open Monday through Thursday from 7:30am 8:00pm, Friday 7:30am-4pm, Saturday 9:00am-2:00pm
- Working on a schedule to offer more online chat hours and reference by appointment

- Short-staffed on tutors; need faculty recommendations; currently have more district workers instead of student workers
