3. Agenda Discussion Items

3.1 Discussing SPGM & alignment (C. Young)

- Peggy & Cameron met with Kevin Fleming to clarify the purpose of the SPGM. Identifies
 committees that were in charge to report out for the areas we're connected to. Shared
 concerns about being isolated in only connecting to one objective. Suggestion to
 develop a tertiary column that lists other groups that contribute, though they aren't
 directly responsible for a particular objective.
- Unity Zone & Ally. Adding these to the SPGM was problematic in terms of its scope. A clear link to Guided Pathways is needed.
- Laura Adams: not all important committees need to align with the SPGM. EX: IRB. It serves an important function, but isn't linked to
- Peggy Campo: These is mostly about accountability to the strategic plan. Our purpose is much more important in terms of how we align to the mission of the college, which should be our focus.
- Jan Muto: The most important thing for us to is to make sure we're serving our own mission. The institution isn't yet ready to integrate this committee/these issues into strategic planning.
- Jan Muto: is it appropriate for LGBTQ+ Advocates to take ownership of Ally? Currently, no one "owns" the program. The committee agrees that it makes sense for LGBTQ+ Advocates to add the ALLY program to our mission.
- Data LGBTQ+ student data isn't accessible. It is being collected but isn't reported transparently. Concerns about data validity/reliability shut down the conversation. Jan will send link to dashboard. We need to push more on this issue.

- Marie Hicks: Can we hold trainings after 3pm so adjunct faculty can attend? Absolutely.
 We have much flexibility in the all online environment.

- J. Muto: Can we develop Part 2 and Part 3? Refresher versions of the course? We will
 explore these ideas going forward.

3.3 Update on Pride Index (J. Muto)

- Campus Pride Index is a national listing of LGBTQ-Friendly Colleges & Universities
- Colleges self-report their information, then are rated based on policies, programs, & practices
- Index can be placed on college website a great way to increase the institution's
 accountability and advertise our efforts. This may help us with legitimizing and getting
 the data we need to be effective.

- Last Spring: President said yes to participating. Pride Index now costs \$225 to join. Jan will follow up about getting funding.
- Brady Kerr: We also need a webpage that welcomes LGBTQ+ Students. We need a webpage for LGBTQ+ Advocates.
- Cameron previews created a Canvas shell that has pages for many of these functions (ALLY, Unity Zone, etc.) - a team is needed to help develop this
- Need for a button, badge, etc. check with Marketing Committee & Lenny Riley
- Several online/web-based needs were identified in this discussion, including:
 - Canvas shell (Cameron Young, Peggy Campo)
 - Campus Pride Index (Jan Muto & Peggy Campo)
 - Main Welcome Page (hold off for now)
 - LGBTQ+ Advocate Faculty Committee Page (Laura Adams)
 - Button/badge visual mark for main webpage

3.4 Update on Curriculum (L. Adams)

- Two separate groups were working on creating an ADT for Social Justice Studies. One group emerged from an ethnic studies lens, while the other group emerged from the LGBTQ+ Advocates. We merged forces so work isn't duplicated and to combine our efforts into a single problem.
- SJS ADT Work Group met 10/01/2020.
 - We reviewed the Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC). There is a pathway for transfer to CSU for an SJS degree.
 - We reviewed SJS degrees from several other California Community Colleges. We
 decided to model our program after <u>Skyline College</u>. This was selected because
 of the dual emphasis on race/ethnicity and gender/sexuality.

- We want to start with courses we already have and then add/expand as we go.
- Subgroups were created to identify existing courses that would fit within the program's required areas
 - Required Core Courses (L. Nelson, & J. Cobb)
 - AREA 1: History or Government (D. Payan, A. Kramer)
 - AREA 2: Arts & Humanities (J. Muto, C. Young)
 - AREA 3: Social Science (A. Gray, A. Kramer)
 - AREA 4: Quantitative Reasoning & Research Methods (L. Adams)
- The group will work with counselors to make sure other transfer requirements are embedded within the ADT
- o Next meeting for SJS ADT Work Group is 11/05/2020 1:00-2:30pm
- We should continue to be aware of the district centric push to create an ethnic studies discipline/program
- o Jan Muto: Check out Ann Pfeiffle's email about ethnic studies
- Brady Kerr: could this (LGBTQ+ discussion/advocacy) happen at a district level? Most of
 it comes through Lorraine Jones. At RCC invested in an LGBTQ+ counselor, and was
 overseen by a Dean. At MVC Michael Schwartz runs ALLY and it is student centered.

3.5 Update on creating an "online" Unity Zone (C. Young)

- Embodied in Canvas shell. Cameron scanned materials and uploaded to the shell. PDFs are not accessible. District may be now taking this on. Contact Greg Ferrer.
- We no longer have staff or funding for the Unity Zone. :(
- Danae will hold off on crafting letter about online Unity zone so it can include links to the shell.
- Unity Zone website still lists Jan Muto as the primary contact ask Daniela to change.
- Let's focus on creating it, then we'll keep fine tuning it. Let's get something in place for students, ASAP. Brady will create art work for flyer & site.
- The site should include a list of Allies
