A **SOCIOLOGY** degree teaches students about the development, nature, and transformation of societal organization. Core courses include the examination of historical and contemporary theory and research as the basis from which to gain an in-depth awareness and understanding of the world in which we live. Emphasis is placed on how social structure creates inequality based on group membership such as ethnicity, class and gender. Social forces such as social conflict, collective behavior, social movements, and organizational and institutional influences are explored.

- ⇒ **Social Perceptiveness** — being aware of others' reactions and understanding why they react as they do.
- ⇒ **Writing** — communicating effectively in writing as appropriate for the needs of the audience.
- ⇒ **Active Learning** — Understanding the implications of new information for both current and future problem-solving and decision-making.
