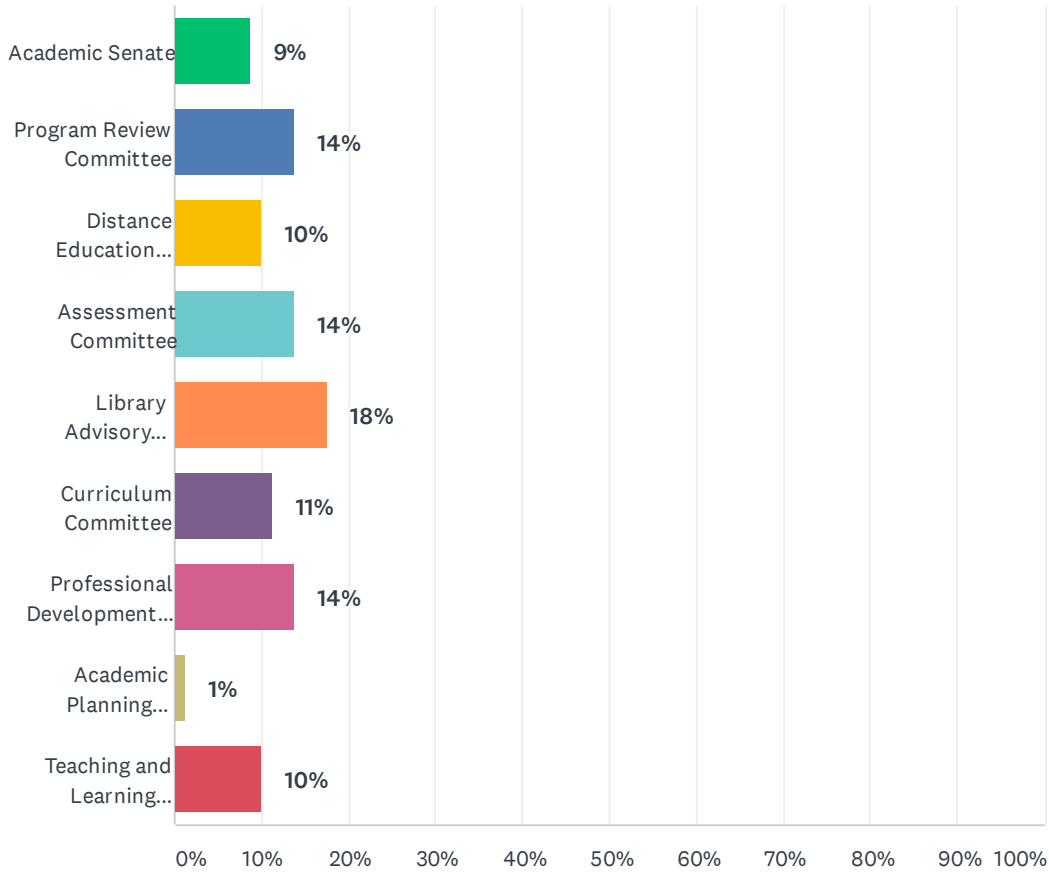


## Q1 Which committee are you evaluating today using this survey?

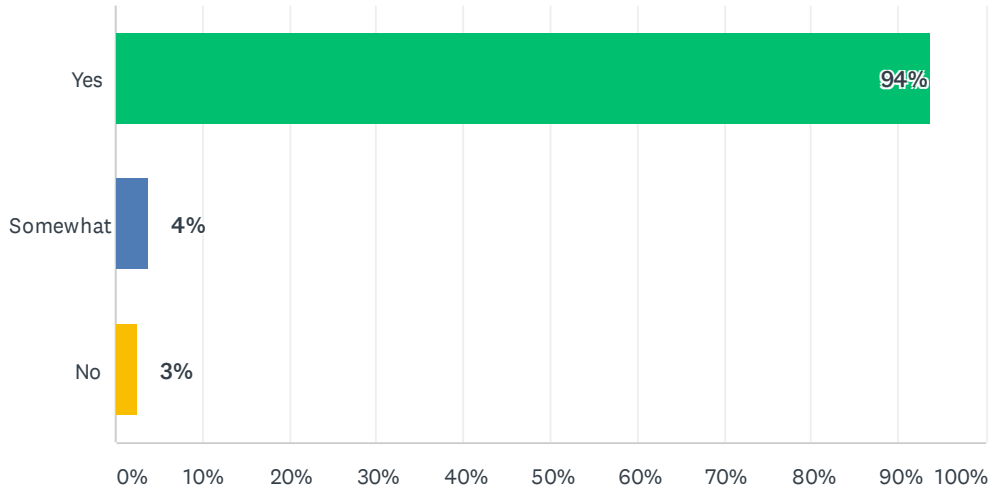

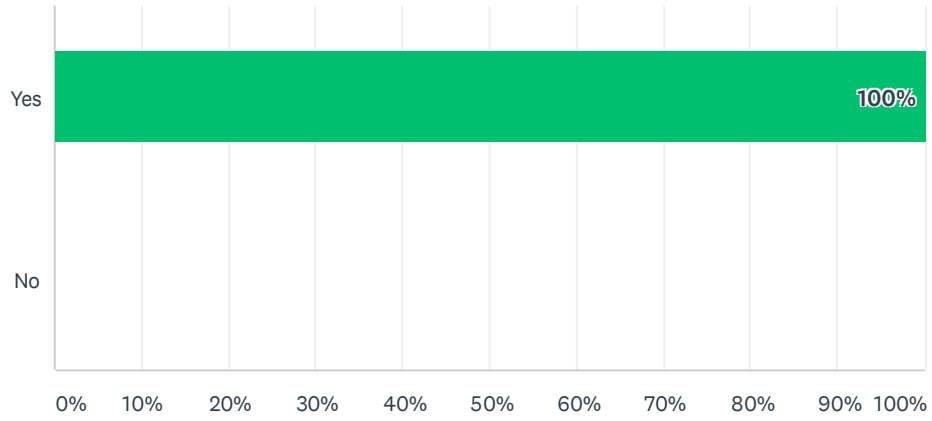

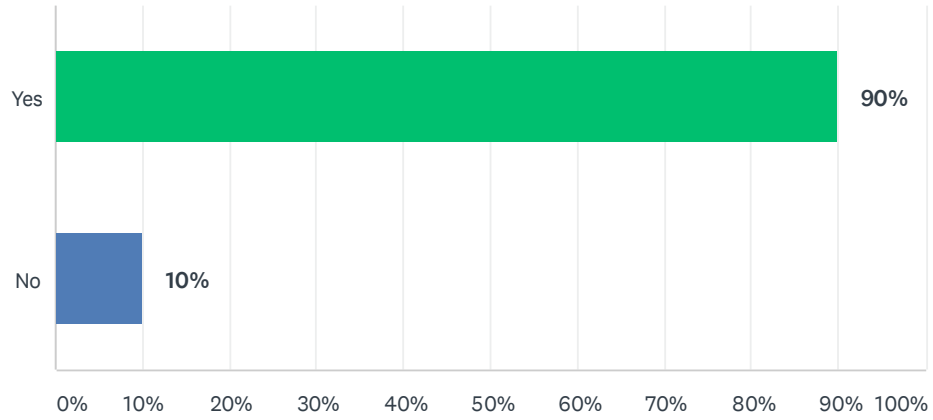

## Q4 Are the agenda items usually completed within the meeting time?

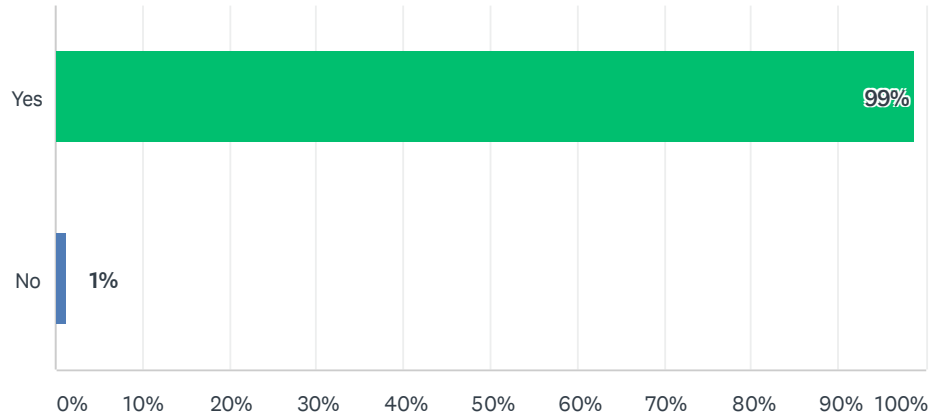

## Q5 Are committee members given adequate information to make informed recommendations and decisions?

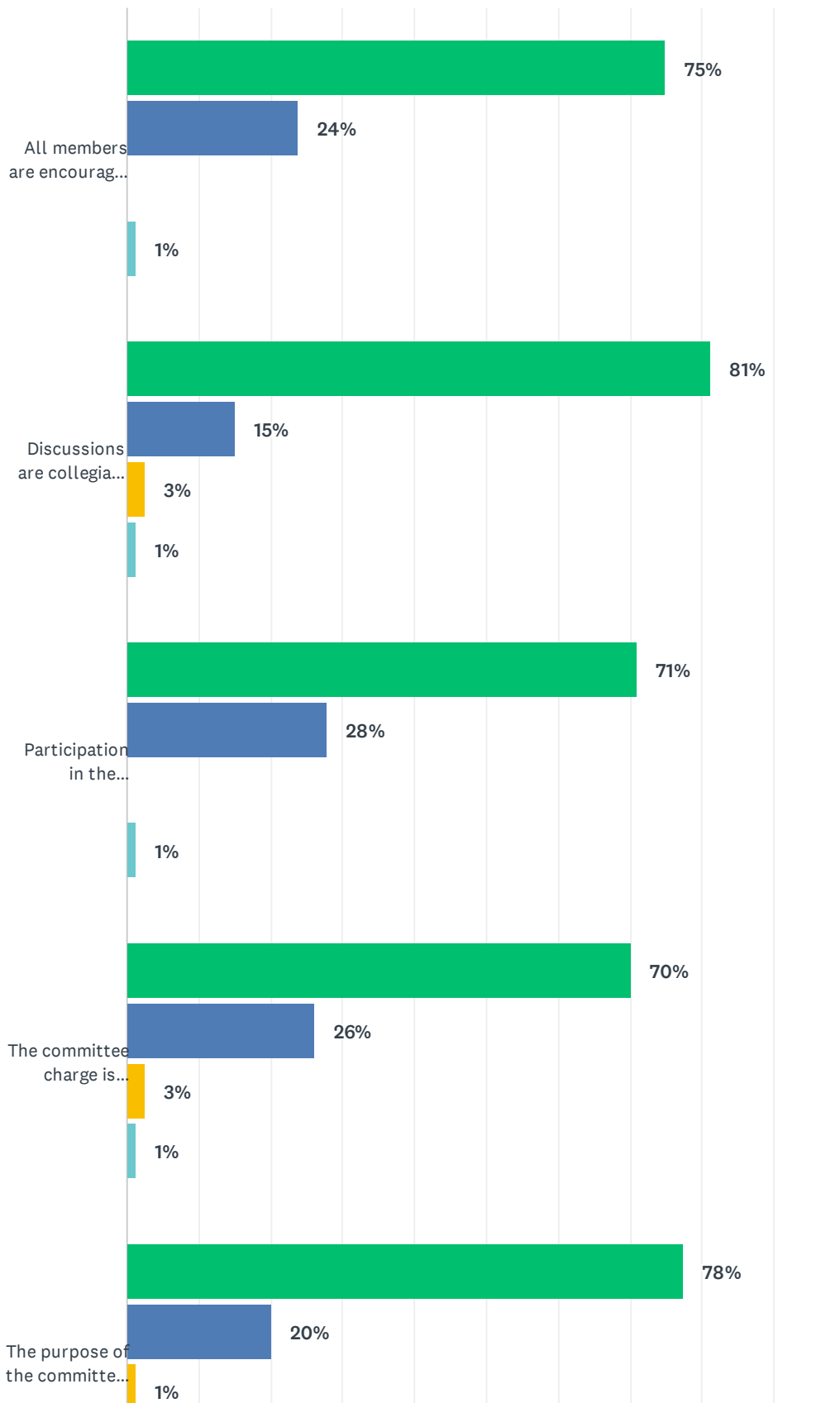

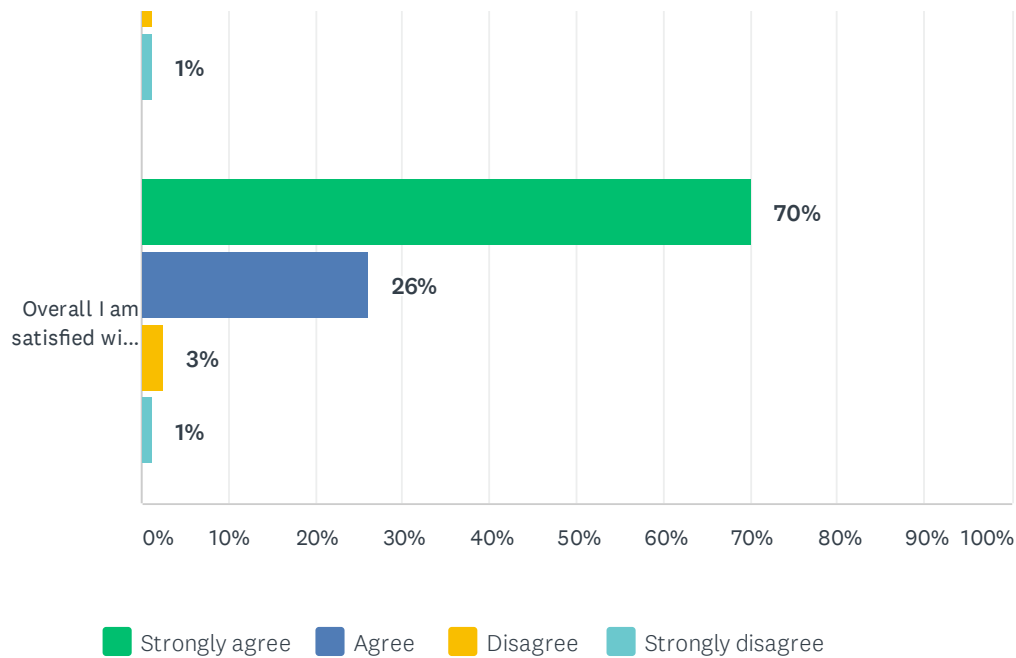

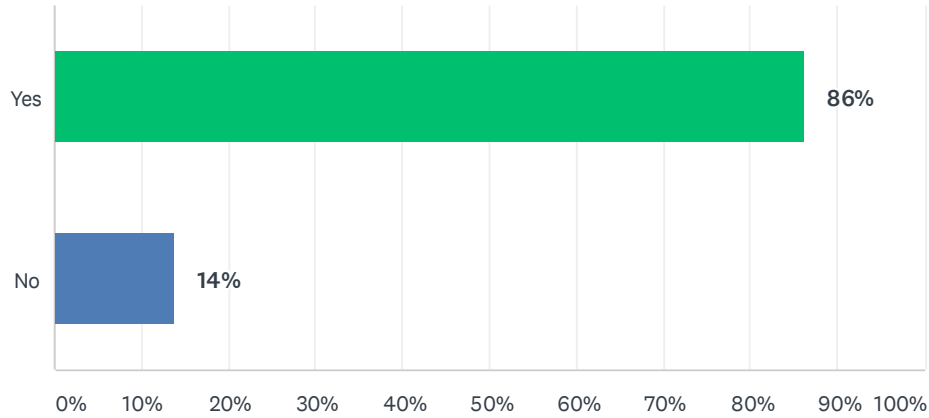

32	This committee has banded together and done amazing things for the college to help the transition to online learning. Michael, Sheila, and the committee have worked diligently in an environment of great uncertainty and incomplete information. On the other hand, it is hard to be satisfied with our progress, when we require a strategic plan to unify our efforts and sustained support to carry us forward in a new era. To be successful, our committee, and all Norco faculty require consistent leadership (DE Dean / DE coordinator), staff support, and greater reliability in gaining access to training and technology. We also need our Norco College administrators to engage the DE committee more frequently in dialogue and decision-making. This includes greater access to DE relevant information and clarity on appropriate avenues and areas for our input. Lastly, we need greater transparency and access to information in order to generate data informed policy recommendations - particularly around equity in the online environment. I list a series of unanswered questions below as examples of uncertainty that constrains our ability to effectively support the college. What is our role in this new era when the entire college is online? What is the strategic plan and benchmarks to be met for DE? Although the committee's charge aligns with the college's mission, there are gaps in terms of lines of communication, sustained support, and understanding of how to fulfill our mission to provide an "inclusive and innovative approach to learning." For example, should all classes (where it makes sense) be submitted to the CC for hybrid / online approval for the fall? Should curriculum issues and coordinating with the CC be our priority? What are the college and district priorities for our committee / DE education in the COVID-19 era? What are our institutional goals for expanding DE courses? How can disciplines be supported and engaged in expanding their disciplines' DE offerings? How can we ensure that faculty know and comply with the OEI rules for online education? How can we continually share best practices in regular and substantive contact, accessibility, and equity in DE courses? How do we increase participation of STEM on the DE committee to ensure that a balance of schools are represented and engaged in these issues? Or, should our focus be on how can we get technology to faculty and students to promote engagement and success? What are the methods by which faculty and students can make resource requests to support online teaching and learning in these emergency circumstances? Should a priority be to identify support, training or peer mentors for faculty who have never taught hybrid or online courses before? Should the committee make recommendations / requests about which of the apps we use will be supported in years to come (3C Media, Pronto, TechSmith Relay, Proctorio, Respondus, Smarter Measure)? If so, to whom? We don't know which apps will be reliably available - as is illustrated with the loss of 3C Media closed captioning - that is no longer available to faculty this year. Should the focus be on coordinating with PDC and TLC to engage the faculty through intentional outreach / training on how to use these resources effectively? How are we ensuring our students are prepared for online courses? How will our faculty and students learn about how to use Canvas conferences, chat, Zoom meetings, Google hangout etc? What is being done with the data generated by apps such as Smarter Measure's assessments of student readiness to leverage their findings at the	4/22/2020 1:26 AM

institutional level? Will the accessibility support for documents from the "A Team" continue after this semester? Will our faculty have permanent support for accessibility (Ally, Udolt, mentors etc)? Will this be an ongoing priority with the appropriate attention and support required? Will the Norco online website be temporary or a permanent as a resource? What form will IOIs take for DE courses moving forward? Will the College focus on using Canvas outcomes to promote and improve our assessment using tools within Canvas? Or, equity and the addressing the digital divide? Should repeated professional development opportunities for on equity in DE, UDL, and accessibility be prioritized? Lastly, do we want to join the online Consortium - and allow our students to take online courses from any college that participates? What weight do our recommendations have on all the matters mentioned above? Who should we raise them with at Norco? Without a strategic plan and direction from leaders in the college, members of the committee clearly have more questions than answers. This lack of access to relevant information to inform our direction reduces our effectiveness. In sum, our committee could greatly benefit from greater access to data & information, increased engagement with our Norco leadership, and demonstrations of tangible support / dialogue / outreach across the campus. Intentionally fostering a culture that is supportive of DE and our students' (and faculty) success across different learning modalities would help both our committee and college to function more effectively.
