



## **MEN OF COLOR**








Men of Color make up a third of the promise program, but less than a quarter of ADT completers.

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## Norco College Promise Program 2019-20

The Norco College Promise Program is designed to help first-time college students (FTCS) complete their educational goal in a timely manner. Students who commit to the Promise Program receive financial support to reduce college costs and increase their success. A question arose within the college community concerning financial need of Promise participants and the population being served by the program. To address the concern, Promise participants were compared to the entire population of first-time college students in Fall 2019 and ADT completers from 2018-19. The primary goal was to understand if program participants were representative of entering and completing students. Table 1 disaggregates the three student groups by ethnicity, gender (including Men of Color), age and financial aid.

The main takeaways from the comparison were:

- Our disproportionately impacted groups are fully represented within Promise compared to FTCS and there are no gaps in representation. White students were the only ethnicity group with considerably lower representation within the Promise Program compared to FTCS (17.6% vs. 21.9%).
- Promise students receive the Community College Promise Grant and the Pell Grant at a higher rate (64.8%) than all FTCS (40.4%). Students with less financial need are not utilizing the Norco Promise program at a disproportionately higher rate.
- There is a gap in the proportion of ADT attainment (23.4%) for Men of Color compared to FTCS (33.6%) and Promise participants (32.7%). Men of Color make up about a third of the FTCS and Promise population, but less than a quarter of ADT completers. (34 more Men of Color would need to complete an ADT to close this gap, please see the Norco College Student Equity Plan for more detailed information)
- There is also a gap in the proportion of ADT attainment (38.7%) for Males compared to FTCS (51.9%). Males make up more than half of the FTCS population, but only 38% of ADT completers. This may be attributed to the ADT completion gap within the Men of Color population (refer to bullet point above).
