





39.2% Lack of interaction/connection with other students





22.8% I'm worried about risking exposure for myself and others to Covid-19 if I have to come to campus


Fall 2020

If courses remain online in fall 2020, how would you prefer they be offered:

Combination of synchronous and asynchronous meetings where students have the option to attend, but also have the flexibility to watch a recorded version on their own schedule

Asynchronous (recorded) class meetings, meaning lectures and updates are recorded, and made available for students to watch on their own schedule

Synchronous (live) class meetings, meaning a set time to connect online each week and hold a class session for all students at the same time
