Norco College and JFK Middle College High School Math Alignment Project

In 2006, Norco College (NC) and JFK Middle College High School (JFK) established an agreement to align Algebra 2 at JFK with Math 35. Math 35 serves as a prerequisite for several college-level math courses at NC. The agreement establishes that students who earn a grade of A or B in Algebra 2 at JFK could enroll in a college-level math class that has Math 35 as a prerequisite without having to take the RCCD placement test.

Data was provided for 69 students who were part of the project and had successfully completed Algebra 2 at JFK between Fall 2007 and Fall 2010. Students records for these students were matched with the college MIS data and the first attempt at a math course was identified. Of these students, 47 (68%) enrolled in a math course. Table 1 shows the list of courses which was the first math course into which the students enrolled as well as success rate.

The table shows that the overall success rate of these students in their first math course at NC was 74%. What is interesting is that 6 students enrolled in the same course when they started at NC (Math 35) and 3 students enrolled in a lower course. This seems unusual given that these students passed the Algebra 2 course with an A or B. (Math 35 is in bold in the table above to indicate the courses next in the sequence after Math 35.)

Of the students who took a higher level course, 29 out of 38 students (76%) passed the course. This pass rate is well above the average placement rate of students who test into college-level math through the RCCD placement test. For comparison purposes, the percentage of students who placed into college-level math in the 6 months prior to Fall 2010 and who enrolled at NC was 5.3%.
