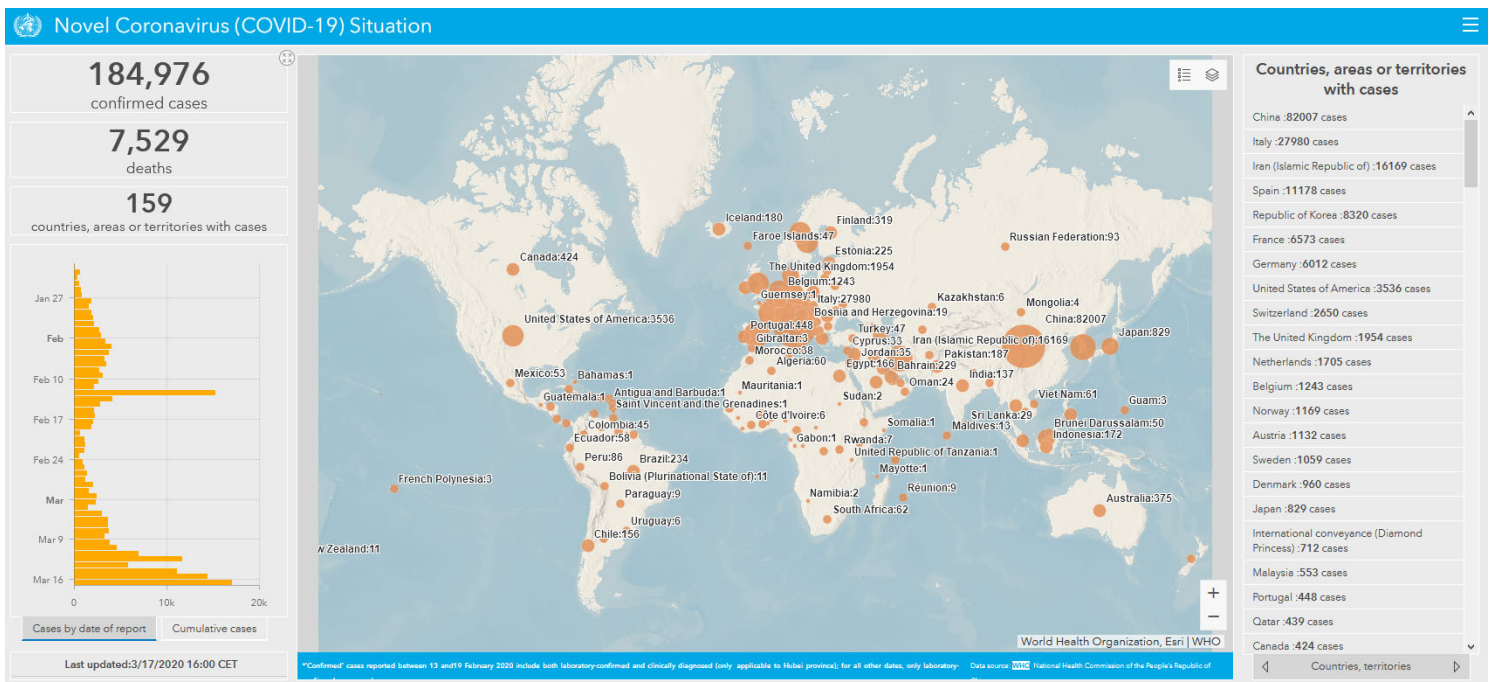
Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

- Russia will close its borders on Wednesday

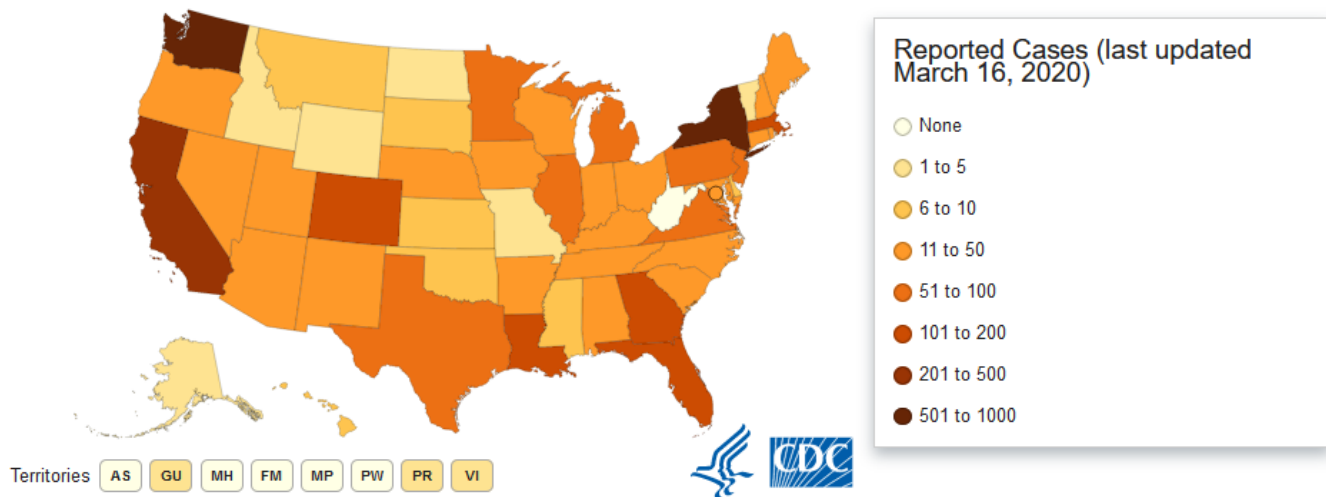

State California Update:

Governor Newsom adjusted his recommendation from respiratory precautions to droplet precautions.

- State guidance for individuals 65 years or older is to shelter in place, effective 3/16/2020

California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO)

- 60 colleges are fully or mostly transitioning to online instruction. A few colleges are suspending classes for 2-to 3-days to make the transition. A popular target date for colleges to complete the transition to broader online access is March 18, 2020. Colleges are leveraging spring break to make this transition.

State University System (CSU)

- Campus continuity plans are focused on transitioning instruction to alternative modalities, while other campus operations including housing and dining are continuing.
- 22 campuses have planned for “virtual instruction”. Campuses are considering exceptions for specific courses that they believe virtual instruction would not be effective. Decisions are made at the individual campus locations.
- CSU campuses with EOC activations: Long Beach, Monterey, Stanislaus, Humboldt, North Ridge

City of San Francisco

- San Francisco Mayor London Breed said the city will require people to stay at home except for essential needs in response to the coronavirus outbreak. Breed said the order will go into effect at midnight and will remain until April 7.

Local County/City Updates:

Los Angeles:

- The LACoDPH confirmed 25 new cases of 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)
- To date, Public Health has identified 94 cases; of these, 15 cases are likely due to community transmission. 2 of the cases confirmed today were hospitalized.
- Limiting gatherings to 50 or under, Closing movie theaters and requesting restaurants to close sit in dining

San Bernardino:

- Second case of novel coronavirus recorded within County
- The following are closed until April 3rd
 - County Regional Parks, including Calico Ghost Town
 - County museums and historical sites
 - County branch libraries

Riverside:

- **Riverside County Health Officer Dr. Cameron Kaiser issues order to cancel gatherings of 10 or more people effective 3-16-2020**
- All schools and institutes of higher learning in Riverside County were ordered closed by order of the Health officer beginning March 16, 2020 through April 3, 2020 inclusive. Affecting 427,744 Students.
- School districts throughout Riverside County collectively served 25,000 meals (breakfast and lunch) to students affected by school closures today with plans to continue through the week.
- No current plan for formal quarantine but not beyond the realm of possibility
- Majority of Riverside County hospitals have implemented modified visiting hours and procedures.
