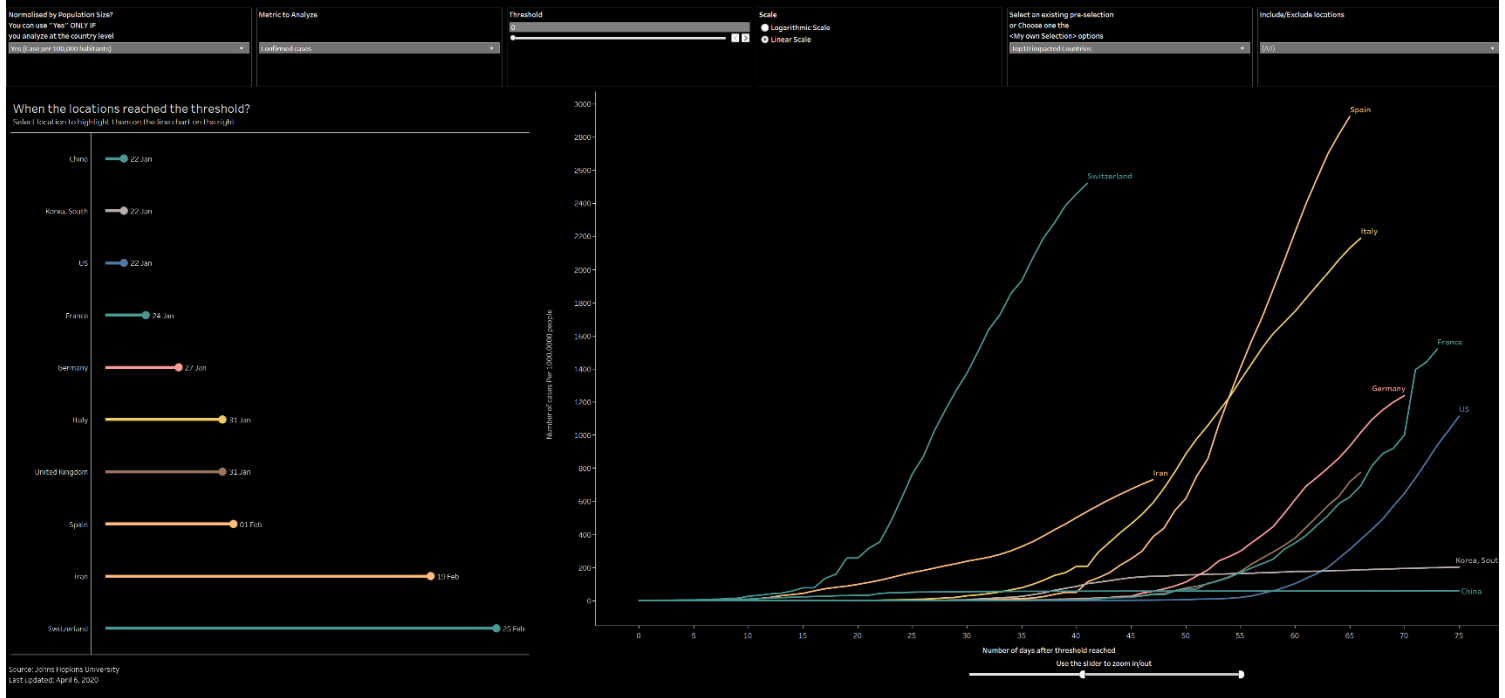

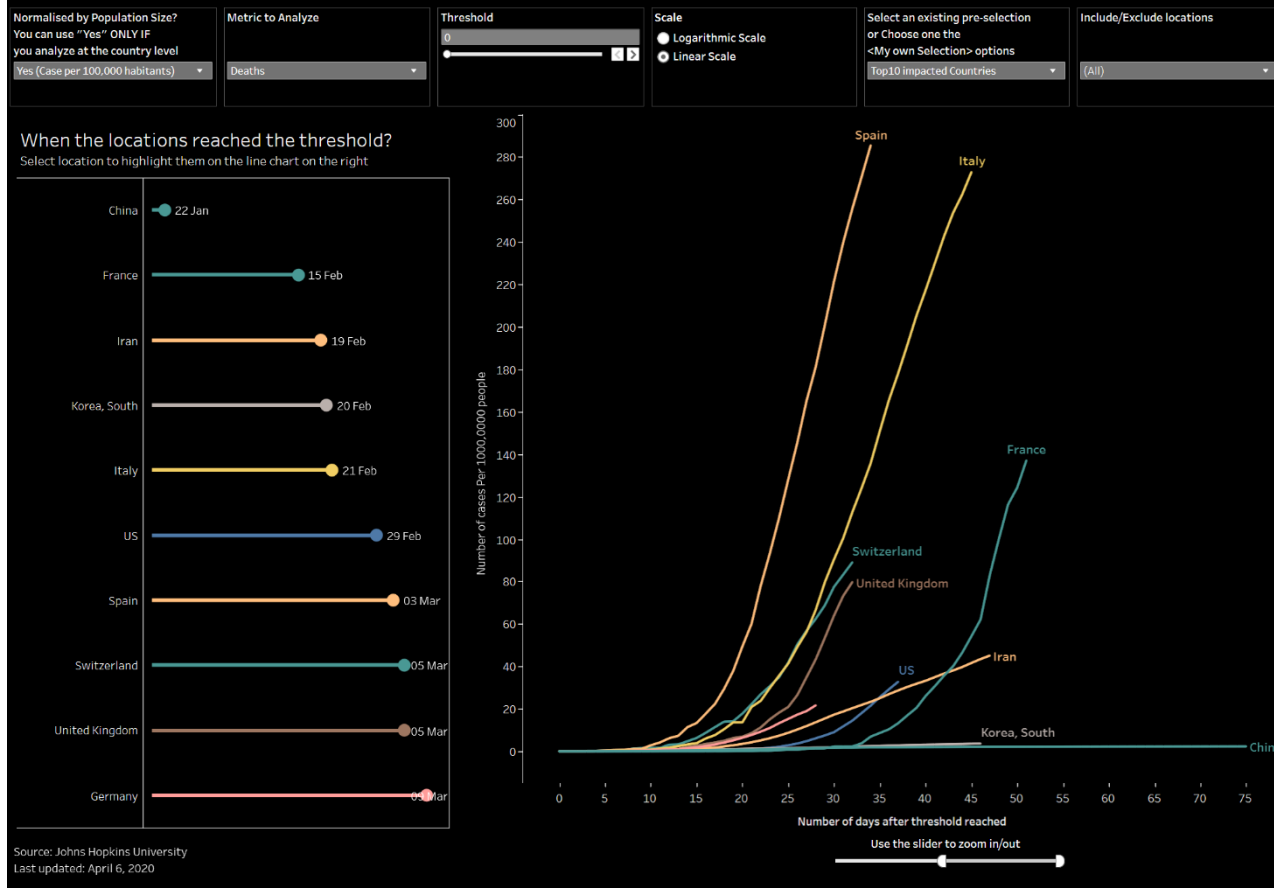

Spain coronavirus deaths rise for second day in a row

- Spain has recorded its second consecutive daily increase in the number of deaths from coronavirus following a week-long decline, according to data from the Health Ministry released Wednesday.
- Figures show 757 people died in the past 24 hours, an increase from 743 deaths recorded the previous day. However it was only a 5.5% in relation to the total number of deaths, a slight slowdown compared to Tuesday's 5.7% rise on the total.
- According to the Health Ministry 14,555 people have now died from the novel coronavirus in Spain

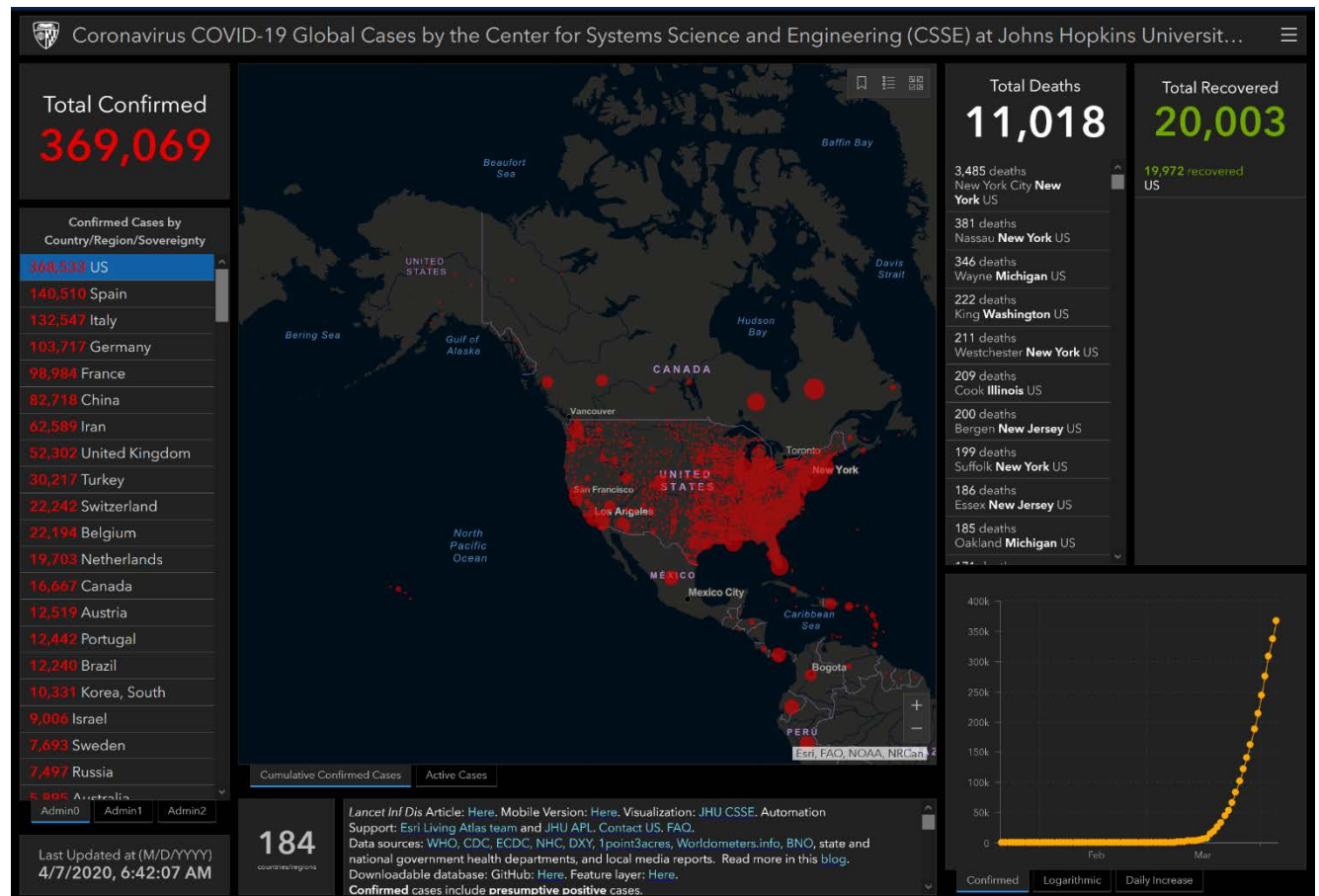

California

- CalSTA, Caltrans, CalOES, GoBiz and California Volunteers are having a conference call this on April 7, 2020 to discuss the roll out of an Executive Order to allow food trucks in roadside rest areas. This will help keep the supply chain flowing smoothly by allowing truckers more opportunities to eat while they are on the road.
- Caltrans is putting out a bulletin to share with trucking companies and industry that the Department is allowing permit request for overweight divisible loads. Truck weights for emergency relief deliveries will be raised from 80,000 to 88,000 pounds.
- CPUCs Consumer Protection Enforcement Division is posting info on their website for carriers who want to voluntarily suspend their operation. The information provides procedure for insurance cancellation upon voluntary suspension of a transportation carrier authority.
- TCPUCs Rail Safety Division reports that BART is going to 30 minute service starting April 8, 2020 morning.
- CDFA has developed an SOP and reporting mechanism for COVID-19 testing of animals, drafted talking points regarding the positive COVID-19 positive detection in a zoo tiger in New York.

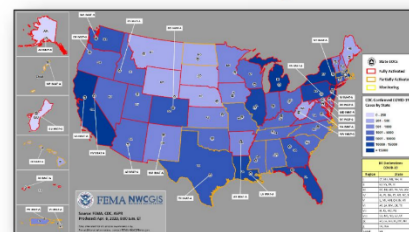

These shipments are being sent nationwide with prioritization given to areas in greatest need.

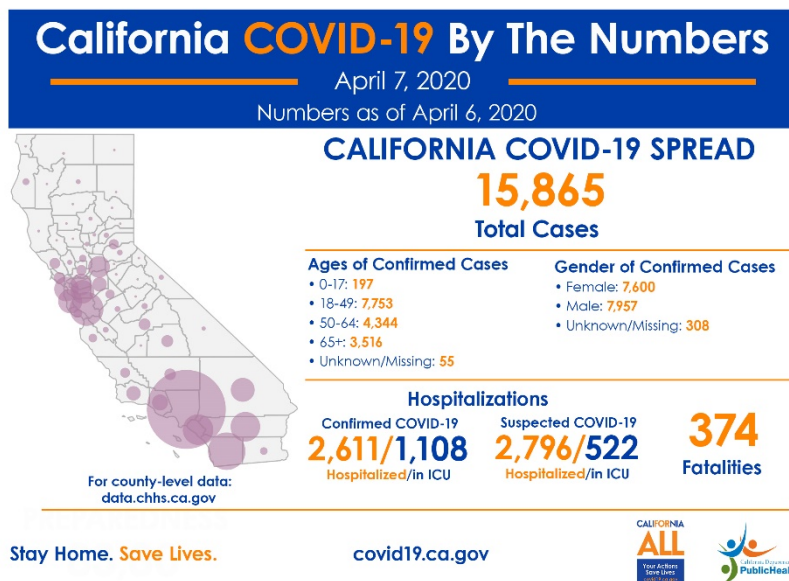

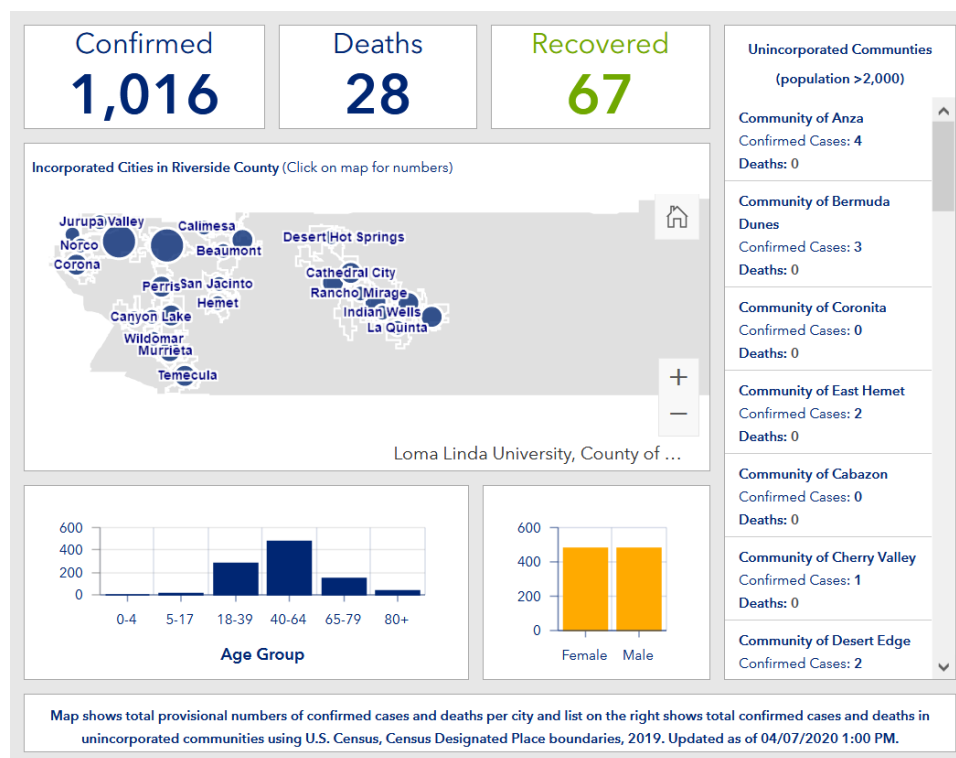

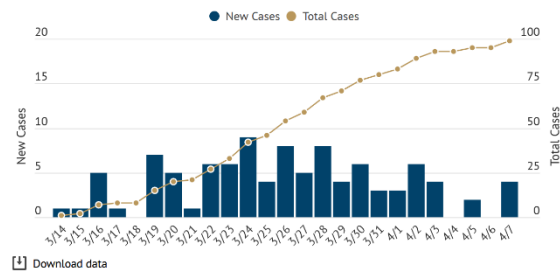

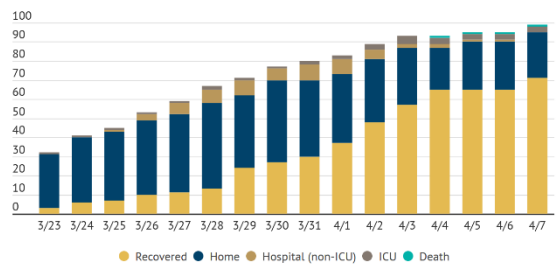

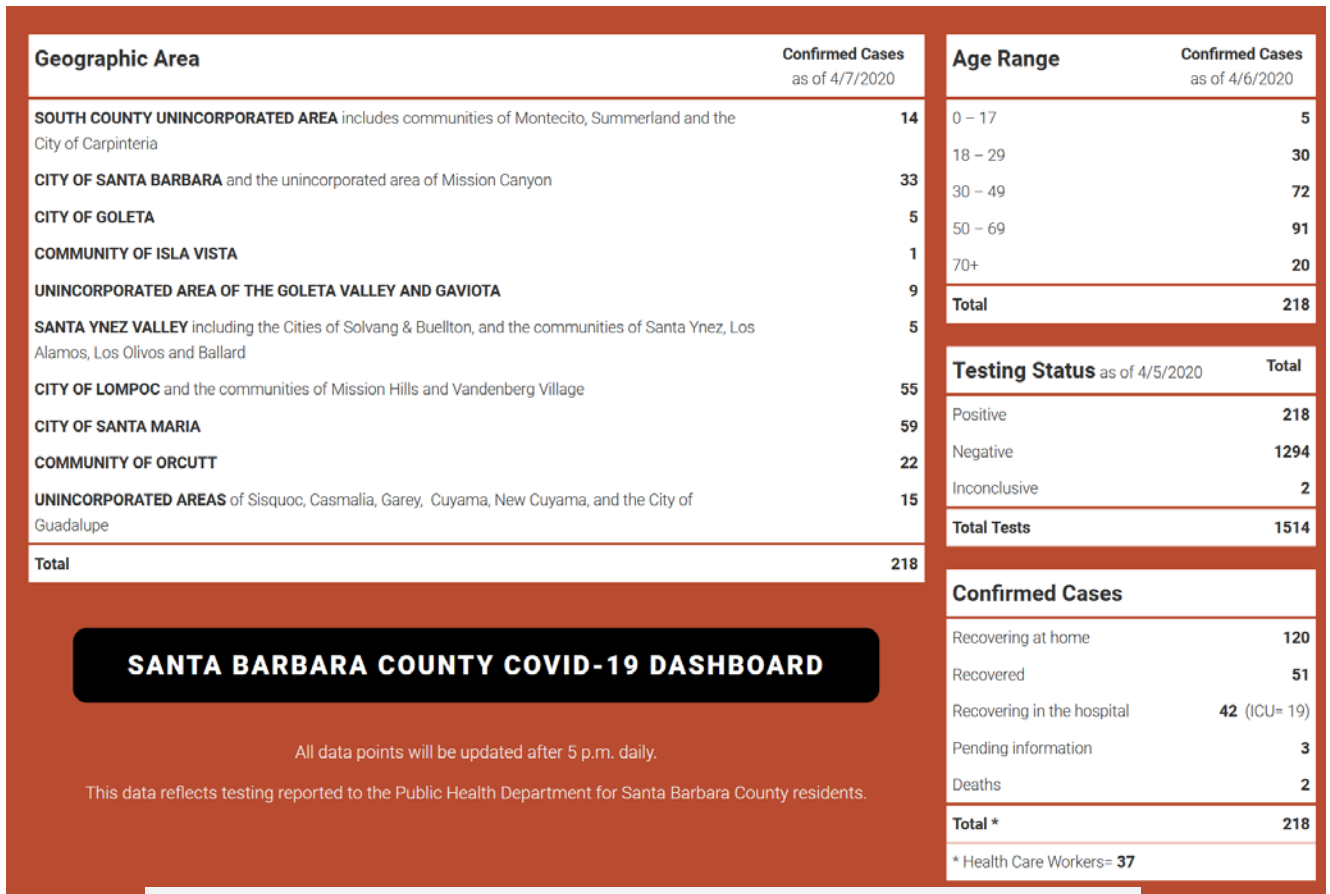

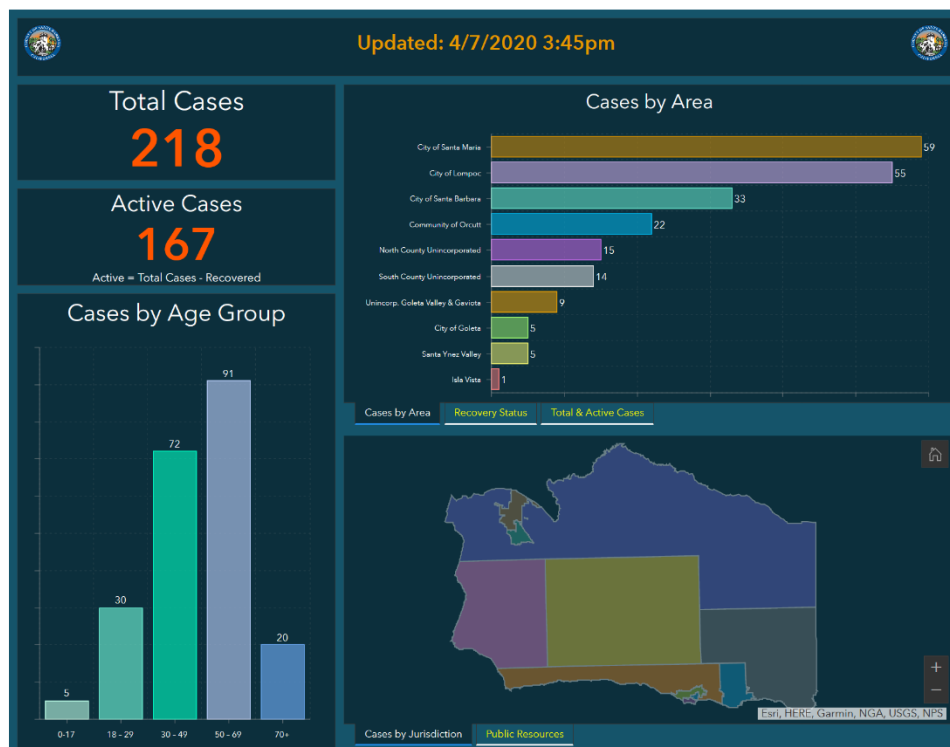

What You Need to Know About the Census

Every 10 years, people across the country and in California fill out the Census in order to have an accurate count of all people in the United States. The Census determines California's funding for some student financial aid, healthcare, housing, transportation and other important student services. The Census also helps to reassign seats in the U.S. House of Representatives, ensuring our fair share of representation in Washington, D.C. Remember, more seats equal a greater voice in what happens on our campuses and in our communities!

YOUR INFORMATION IS SAFE
The U.S. Supreme Court ruled that immigration and citizenship status will not be asked in the Census. Your Census data is safe, protected, confidential and will not be shared with the federal government or any other organization.

Important Census Dates

- March 12 – 20: 2020 Census letters will be mailed, explaining how to complete the Census form
- March 16 – April 3: Reminder notifications mailed
- April 1: Check your campus and community for Census Day activities
- April 8 – 27: Hard copy of Census form and final reminder notifications mailed
- April 28: At home in-person follow-ups begin to households that have not filled out the Census

Starting in mid-March 2020, each household in California will get a letter in the mail. The letter will explain the different ways you can fill out the Census. If you don't receive a letter, you can still go online or call to fill out the Census. Be sure you include all people living in your household, family or not, regardless of their citizenship status.

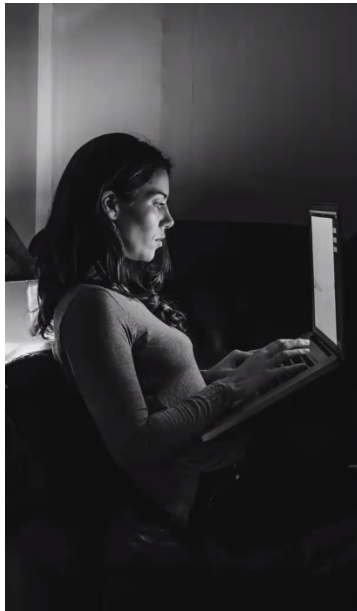

EOPS Guidance: Grants & Emergency Loans

- Executive Order 2020-03 suspends title 5, section 56254, including
 - “not to exceed” amount of \$900 per students
 - Total award amount of \$1,800
 - Requirement to disburse grants equally among academic terms
- Executive Order 2020-03 suspends title 5, section 56258, including
 - “not to exceed” amount of \$300 per students
 - Requirement that loans be repaid within the same year the loan was made

EOPS Guidance: Technology Expenses & Workstudy

- Executive Order 2020-03 suspends title 5, section 56295, including
 - required Chancellor's Office approval for technology or software purchases
 - 10% or \$50,000 "not to exceed" limit for supplemental costs
- Workstudy is approved to continue, including payments for students that may not be working.



EOPS Guidance: Counseling & Advising

- Title 5, section 56236 requires colleges to provide a minimum of three contact sessions per term with EOPS-eligible students
- Contact sessions can be offered remotely via a range of technology platforms
- Colleges should strive to accommodate the student's desired form of contact, including honoring delays in contact should students be unavailable due to COVID-19

EOPS Guidance: Program Eligibility

- Title 5, section 56220 requires that students are enrolled full-time when accepted into the EOPS programs, and does not specify a requirement to remain enrolled full-time
- Colleges should ensure that continuing students unable to maintain full-time enrollment are not dropped from the EOPS program
- The 10% cap on admitting students enrolled in a minimum of 9 units remains in effect at this time
- Required eligibility documents, EOPS applications, student educational plans, and EOPS mutual responsibility contracts can be accepted electronically

Fall 2020 Guidance

- The CSU campuses will accept "Credit" or "Pass" for transferable college courses completed in winter, spring or summer 2020 taken to satisfy:
 - A. The Golden Four (English language [A2], oral communication [A1], critical thinking [A3], and mathematics/quantitative reasoning [B4]);
 - B. All other General Education courses; and
 - C. Major prerequisite courses.
- *Some Accrediting agencies have not yet caught up with evolving changes due to COVID-19*

Fall 2020 Guidance, Cont.

- CSU campuses will clear admission for upper-division transfer applicants with 48 semester or 72 quarter transferable units who have completed English Language (A2) and mathematics/quantitative reasoning (B4) by the start of fall 2020 (including courses taken in summer 2020).
 - A. CSU campuses will work with students to enroll in the appropriate general education and major preparation courses to fulfill lower division requirements prior to enrolling in major coursework.
 - B. Students will still need to fulfill all major requirements to receive their degree.
- *Financial Aid will be based on 2nd year levels*
- *Students with less than 60 units or no 2-year degree AND no HS diploma or equivalency may receive less financial aid. We believe this to be a very, very small number of applicants.*

Fall 2020 Guidance, Cont.

- The CSU requests that community colleges that can provide transcripts by July 15, 2020, do so; however, CSU campuses will continue to accept transcripts through the fall 2020 term.
 - New transfer students will remain in a conditionally admitted status until the CSU campus receives a final transcript document and review of the transcript for admission requirements is completed
- Campuses may allow students to defer admission to a spring 2021
- Students on an ADT similar pathway that transfer without their ADT would be provided an special advising agreement.

Eligible and Ineligible Reimbursements

- While not all costs are reimbursable, FEMA may provide assistance for emergency protective measures.
- Each application is reviewed independently by FEMA and Cal OES to determine if, when, and how much may be eligible for reimbursement.

Reimbursable Costs

Actions taken before, during and after a disaster to save lives, protect public health and safety or eliminate immediate threat of significant damage to improved public and private property through cost effective measures, such as:

- Training specific to the declared event
- Disinfection of eligible public facilities
- Technical assistance to state or local governments on emergency management and control of immediate threats to public health and safety
- Purchase and distribution of food, water, ice, medicine, and other consumable supplies, including personal protective equipment and hazardous material suits
- Security and law enforcement
- Communications to the public of general health and safety information
- Operational costs such as reimbursement for state and/or local government force account overtime costs
- Reimbursement for materials pulled from inventory, vehicle usage for control of immediate threats to public health and safety, laptops if used to help facilitate the emergency response

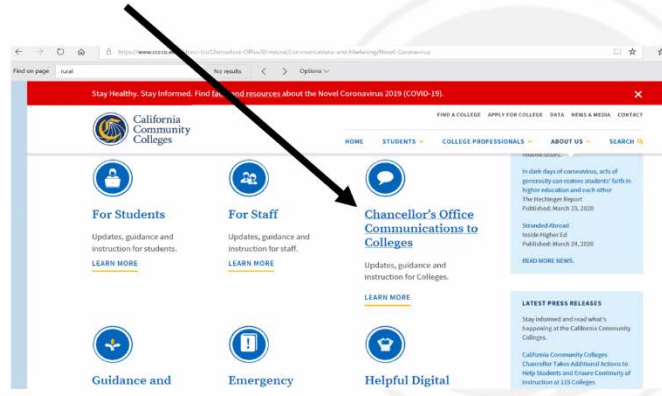

Forecast Discussion

An atmospheric river frontal band with heavy rain is moving through Orange County and western Riverside County and will move into San Diego County this afternoon and tonight. Southwest winds of 25 to 40 mph in mountains/deserts into tonight. An unseasonably strong storm slows and brings waves of precipitation (some lightning) on Tuesday and Wednesday, increasing showers with rain **heavy at times** - precipitation continues into Thursday. Rainfall increases in the deserts and could last into Thursday. **Significant totals of rainfall** (1.5 to 3.5 inches) **most areas** (locally 6-8 inches mountains) and snowfall (12-30 inches above 6000 ft and 3-7 above 5000 ft).
