


IMPORTANT TO KNOW:

- Receiving services through the DRC does not preclude you from also participating in any other course, program, or service on campus.
- Receiving accommodations does not take away accommodations from another student.
- In college, there are no provisions for differential grading or modifying the fundamental course requirements.




THE LAW

We operate under the rights and protections of Section 504 and 508 of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act Amendment Act (ADAAA), and Title 5 Implementing Guidelines

These laws prohibit discrimination solely on the basis of disability and require our college to provide **reasonable accommodations** so that a student with a disability has equal opportunity to take part in college programs and services. The word "disability" is an umbrella term. It is important to note that disabilities can be visible and invisible. Disabilities include, but are not limited to:

- Mental health impairments
- Medical disabilities
- Physical disabilities
- Mobility disabilities
- Deaf/hard of hearing
- Visual Impairment
- Learning disabilities
- Autism
- □ ADHD/ADD
- Temporary disabilities



GETTING STARTED WITH DRC

Acke sure you have submitted a Norco College Application and completed the Online Orientation: https://www.norcocollege.edu/stepstoenroll/Pages/enroll.aspx

Submit the DRC Online Application available on our website: <u>https://www.norcocollege.edu/services/drc/Pages/index.aspx</u>

Email any of the following as documentation of your condition/disability:

- 1) Individualized Education Plan
- 2) 504 Plan
- 3) Medical Verification Form (Primary Care Physician or referral to Health Services)
- 4) Medical Documentation Stating Diagnosis/Limitations
- 5) Veterans Documents (DD214 Discharge Letter, Chapter 31 Letter, Ratings Letter)
- 6) May apply for Learning Disability Assessment if there is no prior diagnosis

Meet with a DRC Counselor to determine which Academic Adjustments will be available to you. You will be prompted in the DRC Online Application to schedule an appointment via Zoom.

ACCESSING SERVICES DURING THE CAMPUS CLOSURE



Serves students with Learning Disabilities/Low Vision • A scan and read program that allows a student to have textbook contents read back to them by a computer




JAWS

Serves low vision users and some specific learning disabilities by enlarging the screen and providing enhanced navigational tools.
