FAFSA and DREAM Application

All students who plan to attend college beginning Spring 2020 MUST complete the 2019-2020 FAFSA application or CA DREAM Act Application online.

The **2020-21 FAFSA and CALIFORNIA DREAM ACT** applications are now available online as of October 1, 2019, and will require **2018** income to be completed.

The **FAFSA** application is available online at www.fafsa.gov.

The **CA DREAM Act Application** (for AB540 Eligible Students) is also available online at <https://dream.csac.ca.gov/>.

Tracking Your Federal Student Aid

You can track your federal student aid online 24/7.

National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS)

allows student access to view grant and/or loan information online at:
www.nsls.ed.gov

How do I access it?

You can log in using your FSA ID, the same one used to log into and electronically sign your FAFSA.

Is it secure?

The FSA ID and Password used to log in, is as secure as using an ATM machine.

The California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) has created WebGrants for students to manage their Cal Grant and/or Chafee account online by allowing you to view updates, make school changes, make address changes, make corrections, and post leave of absences requests.

Pell Eligibility Limits

Lifetime Eligibility Usage (LEU) for Pell Grant Recipients

Regulation:

Effective July 1, 2012, students will be eligible to receive a Federal Pell Grant for up to 12 full time semesters of scheduled awards (600%).

This will generally equal 4-6 years of undergraduate enrollment.

This information is available on your Student Aid Report (SAR) on the FAFSA website at www.fafsa.gov.

You can also track your percentage used by logging into www.nsls.ed.gov with your FSA ID and password.

What does this mean to you as a financial aid student?

The Pell Grant combines your usage from all schools attended, where you received the Federal Pell Grant. After reaching the limit (600%) you will no longer be eligible to receive Pell Grant funding at any school.

You will need to plan out your undergraduate enrollment to ensure that you can complete your educational objective prior to meeting the LEU for Pell Grant.

Meeting with an academic counselor to develop a comprehensive Student Education Plan to ensure you stay on track toward completion of your program, will help.

Cal Grant Limits

Cal Grant Eligibility time limit:

Cal Grant B

Eligible until completion of baccalaureate degree or 4 years at full-time equivalent. (Exception: Cal Grant B foster youth).

Cal Grant C

Eligibility limited to the recognized length of the program or 2 years at full-time equivalent.

NEW Award: Cal Grant A

Eligible students who have dependent children under the age of 18 by July 1st, 2020 for whom they provide more than half of their support may be eligible.

Eligibility until completion of a baccalaureate degree or 4 years at full-time equivalent.

Financial Aid is Available to Dreamers

If you don't qualify for the FAFSA application, you may still be eligible for financial aid. To find out, apply online at www.caldreamact.org

If eligible, you may be able to receive the following types of assistance:

- California College Promise Grant (CCPG)
- Cal Grants (A, B, or C)
- Chafee Grant for Foster Youth (Separate Application Required)
- EOPS, CARE, CalWORKs (Separate Application Required)
- RCCD Foundation Scholarships (Separate Application Required)

California College Promise Grant (CCPG)

The California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the BOG Waiver) requires the same academic and progress standards according to the Student Success Act of 2012 (SB 1456). The conditions of eligibility for the CCPG are as follows:

Students must meet satisfactory academic and progress standards which includes meeting a minimum of 2.0 cumulative GPA and completing more than 50% of the units attempted each fall and spring semester.

Students with two consecutive semesters of not meeting academic and/or progress standards will lose their CCPG beginning in the fall of 2016. Foster youth are exempt from this change and will not lose eligibility based on academic probation.

NOTE: . STUDENTS WITH EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO APPEAL THE LOSS OF THE WAIVER WITH ADMISSIONS & RECORDS BY COMPLETING AN APPEAL FORM.

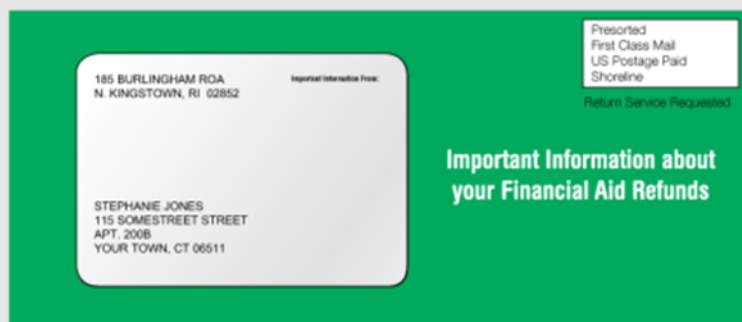
DISBURSEMENT INFORMATION

Students will receive their financial aid funds via Bank Mobile Disbursements. All students will have a "CHOICE" on how they would like to receive their financial aid funds. Options include:

- Direct Deposit into a personal checking account
- Bank Mobile Vibe card
- Paper Check

Use your personal code to log onto the www.refundselection.com website and select your preference. **A debit card is not mailed to you unless you choose it as your disbursement option.**
