Norco IMC invites you to take a look back to August 1990 when state officials gave the Norco construction site a clean bill of health.

Over a year earlier, when construction began, crews found toxic and hazardous materials the U.S. Navy had left on the site.

Construction was allowed to continue in areas where waste was not found but crews had to fence off areas where trash and heavy metal had been found. The college then began the task of removing 20 tons of harmful materials to a Nevada processing plant.

The college worked with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to clean up the waste. During that time the frames of the college's two buildings were erected. Welders worked on both structures that were set to open in less than seven months. The Phase I site began to look like the future Norco College.
