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



GENERAL DUAL ENROLLMENT

These online classes are offered to ALL dual students no matter your high school location

AHS 6-36581 & 36585, Art Appreciation Online. Start/End Dates: 6/16/24-7/26/24

An introductory course for the non-art major. The creative process and the diversity of style, technique and media, evident in various art forms throughout history and culture. (Same as ART-6). UC/CSU transferable... 3 units

COM 1 36629, Public Speaking Online. Start/End Dates: 6/16/24-7/26/24

Prepares students to compose (develop outlines and research) and present a minimum of four speeches, including informative and persuasive presentations in front of a live audience. Emphasis will include: different purposes of speaking, types of speeches and organizational patterns, topic choice and audience adaptation, rhetorical principles, development and support of sound reasoning and argument, theories of persuasion, application of ethics in public speaking, listening skills, and theory and principles of effective delivery. UC,CSU transferable 3 units

ENG 1A 36868 & 36869, English Composition Online. Start/End Dates: 6/16/24-7/26/24

Emphasizes skills in critical reading, and writing, including research. Integrated reading and writing assignments respond to various rhetorical situations. Students will produce a minimum of 7500 words of assessed writing. Classroom instruction integrates writing lab activities. UC/CSU transferable. 4 units

GUI-47-36719 & 36721, Career Exploration and Life Planning Online. Start/End Dates: 6/16/24-7/26/24

In depth career and life planning: Topics include extensive exploration of one's values, interests and abilities; life problem-solving and self-management skills; adult development theory and the changes that occur over the life span; self-assessment including identifying one's skills and matching personality with work. An intensive career investigation decision making, goal setting and job search strategies, as well as resume writing and interviewing skills will also be addressed. This course is designed to assist those students considering the transition of a career change or undecided about the selection of a college major 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

GUI-48-36726 & 36855 College Success Strategies Online. Start/End Dates: 6/16/24-7/26/24

This comprehensive course integrates personal growth and values, academic study strategies and critical thinking techniques. Students will obtain skills and personal/interpersonal awareness necessary to succeed in college 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

PSY-1-36810 & 36813 & 36811, General Psychology Online. Start/End Dates: 6/16/24-7/26/24

Historical and philosophical antecedents of contemporary psychology; the scientific study of behavior and mental processes as systemized in learning, motivation, emotion, personality, intelligence, and thought. 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

SOC 1-36902, Introduction to Sociology Online. Start/End Dates: 6/16/24-7/26/24

An introduction to the basic concepts relating to the study of society. Includes investigation into the foundations of sociology including its overall perspective, theoretical orientations, and research methodology; the foundations of social life including the components of culture, social interaction and the process of socialization, groups, organizations, and deviance; economic social inequality based upon class, race, sex, and age; social institutions; and dimensions of social change 3 Units, UC, CSU Transferable

NORCO COLLEGE DUAL ENROLLMENT FAQs

1. Who can participate?

All students starting freshman year through 12th grade at any of the following High Schools:

-All CNUSD High Schools, Jurupa Valley High School, CAVA, IQLA, and La Sierra High School

2. How do I apply?

Complete the Norco College admissions application through cccapply.org using your personal email address. (Do not use your CNUSD email) Students must create an account and apply online for the upcoming term. After submitting the application, students must wait 1-2 business days to receive the "Welcome to Norco College" email.

3. How to Access MyPortal?

Wait 1-2 business days to receive your "Welcome to Norco College" email sent from admissions@norcocollege.edu (search through all folders, including junk/spam)

Follow steps on Welcome email to login with temporary password.

*Activate your RCCD student email account right away through MyPortal using your RCCD student email and password.

4. How to reset MyPortal Password?

You can request to have your password reset by:

- -Visiting the Admissions & Records office in person with a photo ID.
- -Emailing Admissions@norcocollege.edu, be sure to include your college ID #, Name,

Date of Birth, and a copy of your photo ID for verification.

5. How do I get a registration date?

All students who have applied and received a college ID # and RCCD student email address will need to submit a Parent Approval. Parent Approvals can be accepted by:

- CNUSD Student Connect-Dual Enrollment Approval located in "Activities": Screenshot of Admin, approval for the current academic year can be emailed to Dualenrollment@norcocollege.edu
- PDF Parent Approval form signed by student, parent, and school site emailed to Dualenrollment@norcocollege.edu

6. How to Access Canvas:

- Enter your RCCD Student Email Address and password. If you are a first-time user, your default password is:
 - The first letter of your first name capitalized + first letter of your last name lowercase + the month, day, and year of your birthdate. (MMDDYY)
 - For example, Jane Doe born 7/4/2006 : Jd070406
