Plan for this card reader is for the cashier's office to hold onto it, and clubs are to notify the office when they want to use it. To utilize this, clubs and organizations will need to establish a trust account. It is also noteworthy to mention that outside banks can't be used for student transactions. Machine is \$800 and the service to utilize the machine is \$30 a month.

Senate.03.08.02 Approval of up to \$2700 from Executive Contingency (92199) to fund the Unity Zone's UndocuHustle Event.

The Associated Students of Norco College will discuss and vote to fund up to \$2700 to purchase food and pay guest speakers for a campus event.

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This event is focused on helping undocumented students meet three local business leaders and learn how to build their own businesses. \$200 per speaker and \$1700 for the food. Price was originally \$2700, but the price was negotiated to \$2300. Food will be distributed by getting stamps from all the vendors at the event and those stamps can be redeemed for a meal ticket. One stamp can be received from the survey conducted by the Unity Zone which can give data to use/analyze for next year.

-SURVEY OF EFFECTIVENESS:

Survey asking how effective this committee is, how can this committee be improved and other concerns. Provides feedback about how the committee is run.

-SPECIAL FUNDING FOR ALLY+ CREATION:

> Special one-time funds can be used to make ALLY+ training feasible and that can survive long term despite having one-time funding. Talking about pursuing the possibility of creating a "Pride Center".

-BI, PAN, POLY ALLY+ SERIES PRESENTATION:

Made a training on this, which is a slideshow explaining the definition of bi, pan and polyamorous. Discussing the difference between certain identities and making sure the differences are very clearly communicated. Addressing stereotypes, statistics, activities in this training, how does identity and relationships change when realizing your sexuality, how to support bi and pan folks, challenges for polyamorous folks and how to support polyamorous folks.
