In 2012, under her direction, Mt. San Jacinto College was awarded a Gates Foundation grant to build a developmental writing MOOC. She previously served as the Executive Director of the California Community Colleges' Online Education Initiative. Pat is dedicated to developing guality distance learning opportunities and has just started a new position with American Public University assisting with designing community college partnerships.

Building Relationships in Online Learning Environments
