- Strategic Plan covers 6-year period (2012-13 through 2017-18)
- 2012-13 represents our baseline
- 5 years after baseline to meet goals
- Mapping SP goals to committees so that concerted effort will be made to meet these goals in the next 5-6 years

- Objective 1: Improve transfer preparedness (completes 60 transferable units with a 2.0 GPA or higher).
 - Followed state chancellor's office guidelines: Student Progress and Attainment Rate (SPAR) ->
 - 6 year cohort of new students in 2007-08 who: earned 6 units & attempted an English or math class in the first 3 years.
 - 25.1% achieved transfer preparedness

- Objective 2: Improve transfer rate by 10% over 5 years.
 - Chancellor's office only looks at those that are transfer prepared
 - Transfer Prepared: 58.3%
 - We want a more comprehensive assessment that considers transfer intent as early as possible (SPAR)
 - SPAR: 26.2%
 - Goal by 2017-18: 28.8%= 63 more students transferred

- Objective 3: Increase the percentage of basic skills students who complete the basic skills pipeline by supporting the development of alternatives to traditional basic skills curriculum.
 - 6 year cohort of students who are beginning the pipeline at any level below degree
 - Same as Remedial Progress Rate in Student Success Scorecard→Completed degree-level






Course Completion (Success)




Degree Completion by Ethnicity




Certificate Completion by Ethnicity








Frequency of Use-Student Organizations
